RECOMMENDATION:

The Aviation Advisory Board recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution approving the final report of the 2022 Master Plan Update for Fort Worth Meacham International Airport.

DISCUSSION

The objective of an Airport Master Plan is to determine the role of the airport in the community, determine the relationship the airport has to other system airports, determine the requirements and resources needed to fulfill the airport's role, and document the vision for the airport. It provides the framework needed to guide future airport development that will cost-effectively satisfy aviation demand, while considering potential environmental and socioeconomic impacts.

In May of 2004, HNTB Corporation (HNTB) prepared and updated the current Master Plan for the Airport. Since this update, several construction and improvement projects have been completed, allowing the Airport to further grow and develop. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) advises airport sponsors to periodically update master plans for each airport under their authority so that proper funding for airport improvements may be awarded.

On January 14, 2020, City Council authorized acceptance of a Grant from the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in the amount of \$225,000.00 and authorized the City's match requirement of up to \$25,000.00 through Mayor and Council Communication (M&C) 20-0034 for the update of the master plan at Fort Worth Meacham International Airport (Meacham). Subsequently, on October 20, 2020, City Council authorized acceptance of an additional \$43,290.00 from the FAA passed through TxDOT and an additional \$4,810.00 for the City's match requirement for the update of the master plan.

On or about November, 2020, Coffman and Associates was contracted to perform the study by which the master plan update would be based upon. Four panel meetings, along with public participation sessions were completed throughout the first through third quarters of 2022.

This master plan update will encompass the expansion and numerous changes the Airport has experienced over the past eighteen years and provide a better vision for the future.

The final master plan report is subject to FAA approval and will remain in draft form until FAA approval is achieved.

Fort Worth Meacham International Airport is located in COUNCIL DISTRICT 2.

Meacham Airport

Mid-Field Redevelopment Project

Construction on the utility corridor for the Midfield Redevelopment Project is completed and ready for use. This portion of the Mid-Field Project replaced and extended Commander Road into the new redevelopment area and installed the required utility lines along the road. Parcel sites are ready for developers to easily tie into the road and utility lines now that it is completed.

Taxiway Juliet/Apron Charlie Project

In August, 12" of asphalt was removed and replaced for Taxiway Juliet, which was the first substantial improvement since the last 30 years. Now a substantial improvement to Apron C is receiving attention, with numerous failing concrete panels being removed and replaced. Project estimated to be complete by year's end.

Airport Master Plan Update

The Master Plan process at Meacham Airport is nearing completion. Coffman and Associates conducted a public meeting on June 22, 2022, seeking additional public input. This is in addition to public meetings earlier this year and in 2021. The Airport Master Plan is a long-range plan that takes a holistic view of airport and community trends and is conducted by consultants specializing in this field. The last plan was conducted in 2004 and is typically updated every 10-15 years. This effort takes approximately 12 to 18 months to complete. Once voted on, it will be recommended to City Council to continue in the finalization process.

Spinks Airport

West Side Box Hangar Construction

Contractors broke ground June 17, 2021. The West side box hangar construction

project consists of:

- Construction of a new group 1 hangar access taxi-lane on the west side of Spinks Airport.
- Construction of a 12-unit box hangar. Each unit will be approximately 3,400 square feet.

Hangar completion expected Early November

East Side Hangar Taxi-Lane Design

Design and engineering for the upcoming East Side Hangar Taxi-Lane project is currently underway, with the design nearly complete. The construction of these new taxi-lanes is slated for FY23 and will open additional airport property and set the stage for box and t-hangar construction.

Airport Master Plan

The Master Plan consultant selection for Spinks Airport is currently underway with final consultant selection is expected in to occur in November.

The last Master Plan was conducted in 2004 and is typically updated every 10-15 years. This effort is anticipated to take approximately 18 months to complete.

Alliance Airport

Amazon Environmental Assessment Mitigation Phase

The Public Meetings (virtual) for this project occurred on January 12-13, 2021 and included the following information which was presented to possibly affected homeowners: study/construction schedules, possible mitigation options and how the process will be conducted. Final noise testing performed in February 2022 determined that all homes (264 total) in the Rivers Edge subdivision qualify for sound insulation, which was approved by the FAA, and one-hundred and ninety-one (191) homeowners have elected to participate in sound insulation with sound completion now complete on sixteen (16) total. Of those homes, none have chosen the Avigation Easement, nineteen (19) have chosen transaction assistance, three (3) have expressed no interest, and fifty-one (51) have not yet selected. At this time, Bids 1-8 are in the varying stages of the seven (7) month orientation to the construction process and construction on the first home began in late June 2022.

Taxiway Alpha Centerline Light Replacement Project

Field work began in late June 2022 and Phases 1 on the south end of TWY A and Phase 7 on TWY H is complete. The electrical contractor (B-C Company) is currently working on Phase 2 and is incrementally moving northward on TWY A to TWY M as new light

fixtures are installed and the existing conduit is replaced. All field activities and changes to phasing will be completed in collaboration with AFW Operations.

2022 Alliance Texas Aviation Expo Presented by Bell

Due to the successful growth and increase in activity at Fort Worth Alliance Airport, the Fort Worth Alliance Airshow has been rebranded as the "2022 Alliance Texas Aviation Expo Presented by Bell" and includes a new entertainment schedule and modified event features. This event will be held on Saturday October 22, 2022 and will be a one-day only event open to the general public. A rehearsal will be held on Friday October 21, 2022 and is reserved for VIP guests and US Air Force Thunderbirds Friends & Family. On both Friday and Saturday, the Flight Line will be open during the first half of the day to tour and touch static aircraft followed by a two (2) hour aerial demonstration by the USAF Thunderbirds, Bell 505, F-22, and RE/MAX Skydiving Team. All day exhibitors and kidfriendly entertainment will be hosted in the Landing Zone northeast of Alliance Aviation Services. Tickets are currently on sale and are available at www.atxaviationexpo.com.

New FBO Facility for Alliance Aviation Services

Construction continues on the fixed-based operator (FBO) facility upgrade for Alliance Aviation Services at Fort Worth Alliance Airport. The updated facility will be located immediately south of the FAA air traffic control tower on Aviator Way and will underscore Alliance Aviation Services' three-decade legacy of providing award-winning aviation support services for both corporate and industrial aviation operators. Designed by Corgan and Amaze Design, this facility space will encompass more than 20,000 square feet with an additional 64,000 square feet of attached hangar space, providing a total of six hangars operated by Alliance Aviation Services. Construction of the updated facility is scheduled to conclude in the fourth quarter of 2022.
