Purpose of Impact Fees

Water and Wastewater Impact Fees established June 1990

1

Recoup costs associated with growth-related infrastructure 2

Alleviate burden of new facilities on existing customers 3

Growth pays eligible percentage of total cost of new facilities

Capital Improvement Advisory Committee (CAC)

Established by Texas Local Government Code Chapter 395

Real Estate, Developer, Builder Representatives

Extra Territorial Jurisdiction

Composition:

- Minimum of 5 members
- 40% must represent real estate, development or builders
- Must include a representative from ETJ

Responsibilities:

- Advise City on land use assumptions
- Review and monitor CIP
- File semi-annual reports with City
- Advise of the need to update land use assumptions, CIP or impact fees

Impact Fee Eligible CIP


- Facilities owned and operated by or on behalf of Fort Worth
- Water supply, treatment, pumping, storage and regional transmission
- Wastewater treatment, pumping, and regional interceptors
- Wholesale supplier capital improvements (TRA/TRWD)
- Financing costs

Note: Facility expansion does NOT include repair, maintenance, modernization, or improved service

Combined Impact Fee Schedule




CAC Recommendations:

- 1. Collect at rate of 40% of calculated fee consistent with current collection rate
- 2. Phase fee change over a 2-year period (+ \$488/year)
