





Percent Positive COVID-19 Tests in Texas




- Roughly 36% of COVID19 tests are coming back positive
- As a comparison, previous surges have been at 23% or less (Delta averaged in the low 20's)



Tarrant County Hospitalizations


Hospitalized COVID-19+ Patients: Past and Predicted



- COVID-19 hospitalizations are predicted to reach 2,500+ (was 2,000 one week ago) concurrent hospitalized cases by the end of January.
- Roughly 8,000 new (was 6,000 one week ago) COVID-19 infections per day are expected by the end of January.
- Hospital volumes in Texas (COVID19), have increased 44% compared to one week ago and 325% compared to one month ago.
- High hospitalization rates continue to be driven by unvaccinated adults




COVID-19 Daily Hospital Admissions for Dallas, Tarrant, Collin and Denton County By Age Group, % of January 2021 Peak





- Weekly admissions volumes across age groups are approaching or exceeding peaks from January 2021.
- Hospital admissions are reaching new records among pediatric patients and the 18-49 age group.
- Admissions among those aged 50+ are rapidly approaching their prior alltime peak.


Vaccination Facts

- Vaccine supply has not been an issue in many months/sufficient supply on hand


