

FORT WORTH FINDINGS

OVERALL

- Business licensing is simple
- One-stop shop score: 1/5
- Some regulations may make it costly, confusing, and time-consuming to open a restaurant in Fort Worth
- Conditional zoning may pose a high barrier to entry for many entrepreneurs
- Home-based businesses are strictly regulated

ONE-STOP SHOP ANALYSIS



Does the website connect city requirements with process from other levels of government, such as corporate registration?



Can an applicant complete most forms and registrations through a single online portal, rather than in person or through different agencies websites?



Does the website provide sufficient information on all requirements for starting a business, such as zoning, not just for getting a license or permit?



Does the website have a user-friendly, single log-in opportunity so applicants can organize information and track progress in one location?



Does the website guide entrepreneurs through the process effectively with helpful, step-by-step guides?





CONDITIONAL ZONING

ONE SIZE DOES NOT FIT ALL


- Zoning Change Application fee: \$1,200
- Site Plan Review fee: \$800
- It can take up to 6 months for a public hearing to be scheduled
- Expedited review doubles the fee
- X-Team: Wonderful tool, but at \$1,000 per hour is inaccessible to many entrepreneurs



HOME-BASED BUSINESSES

- Only 1 non-resident employee allowed without City Council approval
- All advertising both on and off-site is prohibited
- Direct sales from the home are prohibited
- Unclear rules on how many clients may visit the home


