Submitter Comments: Municipal district plan using high school attendance zones as building blocks. It's not pretty, but this plan creates municipal districts from 35 high school attendance zones as building blocks, to the extent possible. While most zones are in the 30,000-40,000 range, some encompass populations of 50,000 to 75,000 or are not contiguous and must be split between two council districts.

The plan creates seven majority-minority districts by total population, six by voting age population. There are only four minority opportunity districts by voting age. Except for the northern frontier districts, the remaining districts follow the discarded I-820 rule.

District 2 contains all of Carter-Riverside HS, North Side HS and most of Diamond Hill-Jarvis HS in the Fort Worth ISD; also, all of Bell HS in Hurst-Eules-Bedford ISD. Zone populations of Birdville HS and Richland HS in Birdville ISD are negligible.

District 3 contains all of North Crowley HS and part of Crowley HS in Crowley ISD; also, the section of Arlington Heights HS in Fort Worth ISD south of I-30.

District 4 contains Chisholm Trail HS in Eagle Mountain-Saginaw ISD and most of Lake Worth HS in the Lake Worth ISD; also, minor parts of Fossil Ridge HS, Eaton HS, Saginaw HS and Diamond Hill-Jarvis HS.

District 5 contains all of Eastern Hills HS in Fort Worth ISD and Trinity HS in Hurst-Eules-Bedford ISD. Lamar HS in Arlington ISD is negligible population.

District 6 contains South Hills HS in Fort Worth ISD and parts of Everman HS, Burleson HS, Kennedale HS and Crowley HS.

District 7 contains Daniel 9 Grade High School in Aledo ISD; Brewer HS in White Settlement ISD; and Western Hills HS in Fort Worth ISD. It also contains a portion of Wyatt HS in Fort Worth ISD.

District 8 contains Polytechnic HS, Wyatt HS and Dunbar HS in Fort Worth ISD.

District 9 contains Paschal HS and Southwest HS in the Fort Worth ISD.

District 10 contains Central HS and Timber Creek HS in Keller ISD and Byron Nelson HS in the Northwest ISD.

Districts 11 contains Eaton HS and Northwest HS in the Northwest ISD and Saginaw HS and Boswell HS in Eagle Mountain-Saginaw ISD.
