


CHAPTER 1 POPULATION TRENDS

According to U.S. Census Bureau estimates, Fort Worth's population is 918,915. The City of Fort Worth has added more than 177,700 persons between the 2010 Census base estimate and 2020, equating to 24% growth since 2010.

The City of Fort Worth is ranked 13th in the nation. At the current rate of population growth, Fort Worth projects to be home to approximately 1,000,000 people by 2028.


CURRENT POPULATION, 2020

IS FORT WORTH THE 12TH OR 13TH LARGEST CITY?

The 2020 Census identified Fort Worth as the 13th largest city in America based on total population. However, the U.S. Census Bureau's 2021 annual population estimates found that Fort Worth had passed Jacksonville, FL to become the 12th largest city. Between each decennial Census count, the U.S. Census Bureau prepares annual estimates of total population and population characteristics through its American Community Survey. Fort Worth reports these annual population estimates in its Comprehensive Plan to ensure that City decisions are based on the latest population data.





EXISTING POPULATION, 2020






RACE DISTRIBUTION






GENERATION COMPARISON



MEDIAN AGE





EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT COMPARISON










