Project Overview

This capital improvement project is Phase 2 of the Big Fossil Creek Parallel Relief Sewer Main M-402 project. The single parallel sanitary sewer pipeline will impact property owners in Fort Worth, Haltom City, Richland Hills and North Richland Hills.

Project Area

The single parallel sewer main is 66-inches in diameter. It will be constructed east of an existing 54-inch in diameter concrete sewer main.

The north end of the new main will connect to an existing 48-inch in diameter sewer main north of Broadway Avenue in Haltom City. The 48-inch sewer main is connected to the 54-inch in diameter sewer main.

Why is the City of Fort Worth Water Department doing this sewer project?

This project will provide sufficient capacity to provide joint service for the entire Big Fossil drainage area. This includes the wholesale customer cities of North Richland Hills and Haltom City.

The scope of work includes multiple juncture structures and a wholesale customer meter station for Haltom City and one for North Richland Hills.

Will there be lane closures during construction?

The new parallel sewer main crosses under the Trinity Railway Express, Airport Freeway, Midway Road, Big Fossil Creek, East Belknap Street, Boulevard 26/State Hwy. 183/East Belknap Street and Broadway Avenue.

The hours of construction are 7am to 6pm, Monday - Friday and, if requested by the contractor, 9am to 4 pm or 5 pm on Saturdays. Signs will be posted to alert motorists.

Will our sewer service be interrupted?

Sanitary sewer service will not be interrupted. This force main does not connect directly to any customer sewer lines.

The two collector mains currently servicing the Clear Fork Basin area will continue to carry sewer to the treatment plants while the new sewer main is under construction.

What happens if my property is damaged?

Your property will be restored after construction is complete.

The contractor will take pictures and video of the property before breaking ground. We also encourage property owners to take pictures and video (with a date stamp) of their property prior to construction.

Damage resulting from the contractor's activities during construction is the responsibility of the contractor.

How will we know construction is starting?

If you live in an area impacted by the construction, you will receive a door hanger from the City of Fort Worth.

You will receive two door hangers. The first one says "Construction Starts in 7 days." The second door hanger says "Construction Starts Tomorrow."

The inspector will include his/her business card and contact information on the door hanger.

What is the construction timeline for this project?

Construction starts January 9, 2023. The projected end date is the summer of 2024. The contractor will start west of Big Fossil Creek, just north of Midway Road at State Hwy. 121/Airport Freeway.
