Construction on the City of Fort Worth Water Department capital improvement project – Sycamore Creek Sewer Rehabilitation – starts July 5.

This Sycamore Creek Sewer Rehabilitation capital improvement project will rehabilitate the existing sanitary sewer lines – from I-30 South to the I-35/I-20 exchange. The current sewer main does not have the capacity to serve existing customers in the Sycamore Creek basin area, and, the proposed developments that will be located further south. The existing lines parallel new lines.

The sewer rehabilitation project also includes a short segment – 250 feet - of an existing 24-inch in diameter sewer pipe that will be rehabilitated. The pipe is between Sycamore Circle and Ernest Street, south of East Vickery Boulevard, on the north end of Sycamore Park. The contractor will start here on July 5.

Construction hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday-Friday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekends (if requested by the contractor).

Liam Conlon is the project manager and Carmen Drake is the inspector.

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The contractor is Insituform Technologies Inc. and the engineering design consultant is LAN Inc. This project is in Fort Worth Council District 8, served by Councilmember Chris Nettles

The sewer rehabilitation project is part of a four-phase construction project. Phase 1 and Phase 2 are complete. Phase 3 is in construction and Phases 4A/4B are in design.
