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Summary

A 30-inch in diameter sanitary sewer main will be rehabilitated - or replaced - in an area that is bound by Altamesa Boulevard to the north, Harris Parkway to the east, Columbus Trail at Old Granbury Road to the south and Quail Ridge Road to the west.

Construction in the northern tip of the project – north of Altamesa Boulevard - may impact customers in the Quail Ridge Estates and Quail Ridge Estates II neighborhood associations. There are currently no neighborhood associations or alliances covering the Tavolo area.

What streets are impacted?

The segment starts just north of Altamesa Boulevard, between Quail Ridge Road and Harris Parkway. The projected alignment shows the sewer main crossing the following intersections:

- Amelia Avenue (west of Hawes Lane)
- Candlehill Lane (West of Hawes Lane)
- Tavolo Parkway (between Prairieside Drive and Strada CV)
- Foxgrass Place at Bluebill Place
- Foxstem Lane (west of Bluebill Place)

The sewer main ends west of Cerrito Trail, just north of Colina Verde Drive.

Why is Fort Worth Water doing this project?

Fort Worth prioritizes water and sewer line replacements based on available data which includes the water main break history, leak history, CCTV (closed circuit TV) inspection, age of the line, line material and whether there are lead service lines or cast iron service lines.

In this instance, this project is being done in conjunction with current and anticipated development west of Chisholm Trail Parkway and south of Altamesa Boulevard.

Will you need access to our property?

This construction is in existing sanitary sewer easements and in streets. If Fort Worth Water needs access to your property we will contact you prior to the start of construction.

Will our sewer service be disrupted?

The main will be connected to the sewer service lines that serve the project area. Sanitary sewer service will not be interrupted.

Will there be lane closures during construction?

The projected alignment crosses five intersections.

Depending on what construction method is used, there could be one-lane closures when the contractor is installing the sewer main. Signs will be posted to alert motorists.

The hours of construction are 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday-Friday and - if requested by the contractor - 9 a.m. to 4 p.m./5 p.m. on Saturdays.

The contractor will also be doing bypass pumping. Ramps will be installed to allow vehicles to drive over the pipes.

What happens if my property is damaged?

The contractor will take pictures and video of the property before breaking ground. We also encourage property owners to take pictures and video of their property before construction commences. Damage resulting from the contractor's activities during construction is the responsibility of the contractor.

What is the timeline for this project?

April 2022 is the projected start date for construction. The contractor will start at the northern end and move to the south. The current projected end date is late fall of 2022.
