Traffic Calming is the use of physical design features to reduce automobile speeds or volumes to improve the quality of life in both residential and commercial areas and increase the safety and comfort of walking and bicycling. The Neighborhood Traffic Calming Request process is designed to thoughtfully engage neighborhoods in conversations about their traffic safety challenges and to collaborate with them on potential solutions.

TRAFFIC CALMING APPLICATION STEPS

- To submit an application, neighborhood association or group consensus should be established.
- The applicant will be contacted to discuss the submittal process, which will include a petition from stakeholders in the primary affected area.
- 3 The application will be reviewed for completeness within three weeks of submittal.
- Staff will evaluate applications against criteria to establish a neighborhood traffic calming project to be implemented as funds are available.

Criteria Include:

- Street Type (neighborhood street or arterial)
- Crash data Vision Zero High-Injury Network
- Proximity to pedestrian generators such as schools, transit stops, community centers, etc.
- Infrastructure Audit (sidewalks, pavement markings, signage, etc)
- A field visit or walk audit will be performed with participation from city staff, the applicant(s), and neighborhood stakeholders.
- A neighborhood engagement meeting will be held to present findings, receive community input, and determine recommendations.
- Finalized recommendations will be presented to the neighborhood. If there are no changes, then the traffic calming project will be programmed for implementation as funding is available.

- 3) Residents accept that placement of traffic calming designs may be recommended in front of their property, which may impact on-street parking.
