Introduction

• What's This All About?

What's This All About?

Fort Worth is one of the fastest growing cities in the United States. Since 2000, it has grown by 67% and in 2018, it was the third fastest growing city in the nation. Looking forward to 2045, the City's population is expected to grow by another 59%.

While the city's population has growth significantly, its transit services have not. Today, Fort Worth is the 13th largest city in the United States, but Trinity Metro's service is not in the top 50 in terms of either the amount of service provided or ridership. There are a number of reasons for this, and importantly including that Trinity Metro's financial resources are much lower than those of Texas' other major transit system. Transit Moves | Fort Worth is designed to the transit improvements that will be needed for Trinity Metro services to catch up with current demands and to grow in a manner that will keep up with future growth.

The plan has been developed to achieve four major transit-related goals:
