


National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame History

The National Cowgirl Musuem and Hall of Fame (NCMHOF) was founded in 1974 and is the only museum in the world dedicated to honoring women of the West, who have displayed extraordinary courage and pioneer spirit in their trailblazing efforts.

The organization moved to Fort Worth, TX in 1994 seeking a permanent home.

In 2002, the organization opened it's the doors to its current 33,000 square foot facility located in the Will Rogers Memorial Complex, owned by the City of Fort Worth.

(Floor 1 Legends Gallery - Phase 1)

Phase 2 included a \$5.5 million second floor renovation and upgrade that completed in 2019.

In 2015, the museum embarked on a four year journey to improve the interior of the city facility.

Phase 1 included a \$2.1 million ground floor renovation and upgrade that opened in July of 2015.


In 2019, the museum also invested in a \$2.1M improvement to the area directly south of the building creating Alice Walton Cowgirl Park.

The park is open to the public and is utilized by the arts district for public events throughout the year that benefit the community and local businesses.

National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame Expansion Goals

- The Expansion Project will extend a 16,000 square foot "wing" west of the existing building (32,000 square feet).
- 2. Expansion includes new entrance that faces the Alice Walton Cowgirl Park and Dickies Arena.
- 3. Improves access to the supporting parking lot.
- 4. Adds four (4) new gallery spaces to the facility.
- Allows for expanded use of the existing facility including a 250-guest event space on the second floor.
- 6. Allows museum to expand K-12 TEKS programming by supplying additional content in the new and existing building.




Project Renderings + Floor Plans: First Floor







Project Renderings + Floor Plans: First Floor Lobby










Project Renderings + Floor Plans: Second Floor

- Overall Project Goal is \$19M.


Permit Issued Enabling Work Underway

- 1. NCMHOF is operated on city-owned land through a long-standing lease.
- 2. Design for Expansion is complete.
- 3. \$13.5M has already been raised to support the project. Team is working on additional funds.
- 4. NCMHOF Request:
 - Requesting \$6.5M from city to help fund the Expansion Project.
 - Asking for City Funds Q4 2025
 - Funds will support both the NCMHOF
 Organization and city property.
