DON'T KIT-NAP KITTENS!

What to do when you find kittens

- Wait and watch. If you find a litter of kittens, do NOT touch or disturb them.
- If you do not see their mother, it does not mean they are abandoned. The mother may be searching for food, or even hiding from you.
- Check on the kittens, from a distance, for several hours to see if the mother returns.
- Assess the current conditions of the kittens with the following questions.



Are the kittens visibly sick or injured?

If the kittens are sick or injured, carefully take the kittens, and mother (if present), to the FWACC shelter or your local vet clinic.

If the kittens are at least 8 weeks old, they can be spayed/neutered through TNR (trap neuter return) programs. Email FWACCtnr@fortworthtexas.gov for more information.

You'd make a great foster for the kittens until they are 8 weeks of age! At that point, they can be spayed/neutered and placed up for adoption. Email FWACCfoster@fortworthtexas.gov to learn about our foster program.

Wait and watch. Although tempting, do NOT touch or disturb them. It is rare for a mother to abandon her kittens. If the mom returns, leave them undisturbed until they are 8 weeks old or at least 2 pounds. Only take them to the shelter if one of the above conditions are present.
