## Compliance Corner

In February, Code Compliance expedited the demolition of a fire-damaged building on the city's Southeast side. The blaze destroyed the roof and severely compromised the structure, leaving the front brick façade at risk of collapsing into the public right of way and forcing a partial closure of Vaughn Blvd. Working closely with the property owner, officers moved quickly to remove the hazard within days and keep the neighborhood safe.
