Community Collaboration Brings Safety and Support to Meadowbrook Resident

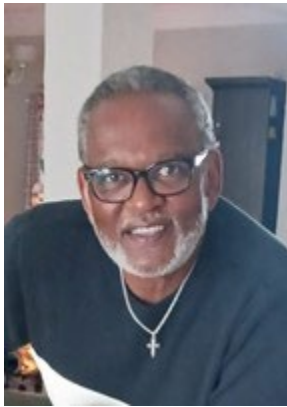
What began as a safety initiative driven by the leadership of the Meadowbrook neighborhood, the Fort Worth Police Department's East Division, Code Enforcement,

Nuisance Abatement, and the office of Jeannette Martinez has blossomed into a true community collaboration. After several months of meetings and discussions, the efforts culminated in a meaningful and impactful outcome for one local resident.

A homeowner on McClean Street, who had been struggling with safety concerns due to frequent trespassing, was identified as needing a backyard fence to regain her sense of security. The resident, Ms. Brown, had reached a point where she no longer felt safe in her own home. The collaborative effort to secure the necessary resources was no small feat, but thanks to the dedication of local partners, Ms. Brown received her new fence this week.

This project is a powerful reminder of the impact that community collaboration can have. It was made possible through the combined efforts of Ms. Brown's neighbors, local law enforcement, and the ongoing commitment of the broader Fort Worth community to ensure safety and well-being for all. 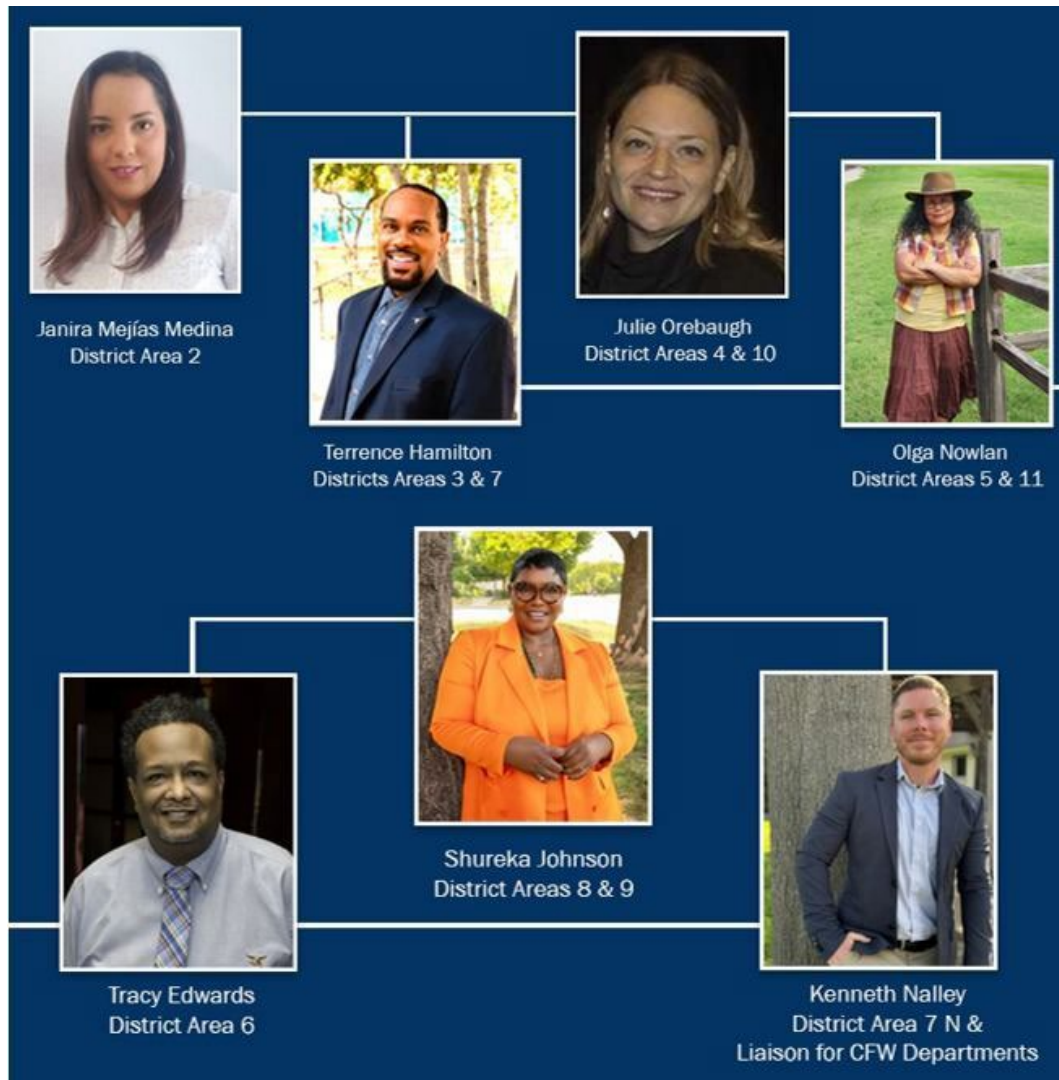
