4. Overview

Overview of GDRC Agenda was presented by Brendan Skaggs with the City of Fort Worth Gas Well Division. The GDRC meeting was a continuation for the proposed transportation route that was submitted at the GDRC meeting conducted on June 20th, 2019. An overview obtained from notes taken by Mr. Skaggs for the conducted meeting are as follows;

BLUESTONE NATURAL RESOURCES – Exelon South

Kyle Alldredge, with BlueStone Natural Resources, presented the transportation route to the Exelon South pad site. He identified that this route was proposed due to traffic restrictions from vehicles periodically parked on both sides of Quail road including a median recently installed by the City of Fort Worth which restricts the turning radius for tanker trucks to access the Exelon South pad site. Mr. Alldredge identified the existing transportatoin route to be altered to allow tanker truck access to the site utilizing Willard Road.

No citizens were present for comments.

Committee members at this time reviewed the proposed transportation route. The Committee Member, Mr. Tom Simerly with Transportation and Public Works identified the previous concern that were discussed from local residents that traffic conditions would impact the neighborhood significantly if the route was approved. In lieu of the citizens concerns, further discussions were conducted between Committee Members and Representatives from BlueStone for an alternate solution which would include the median on Quail road to be removed and additional “No Parking” signs to be installed to allow adequate access to the Exelon South site utilizing the current transportation route. Representatives from BlueStone were in agreement that the proposed additional “No Parking” signs and the removal of the median would lower the possiblity for any concerns accessing the Exelon South site. All Committee Members agreed to the improvements discussed.

The new transportation route was not approved. The current transportation route will remain.
