

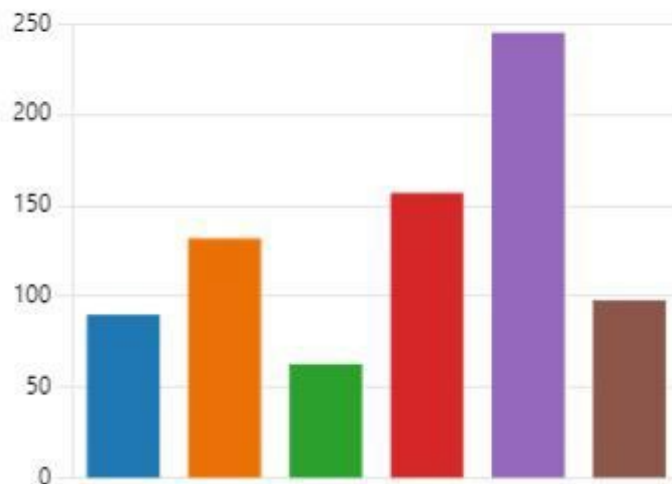
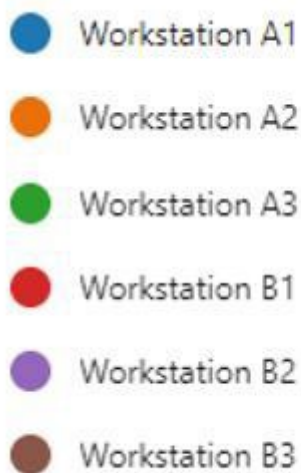


## Future Fridays: A Peek at Our Future Home

Over the past four months, more than 700 employees have visited the concept floor in the tower. That number includes teams from 20 departments and divisions from nine buildings. These visits have allowed staff to come experience and work in the new space and understand new ways of working. The valuable feedback that employees have provided during these visits is supporting the design team in making final tweaks to the workstations, offices and collaboration spaces.

With the concept floor ending July 14, we wanted to share some of the feedback we've received from staff over the nearly four-month project:

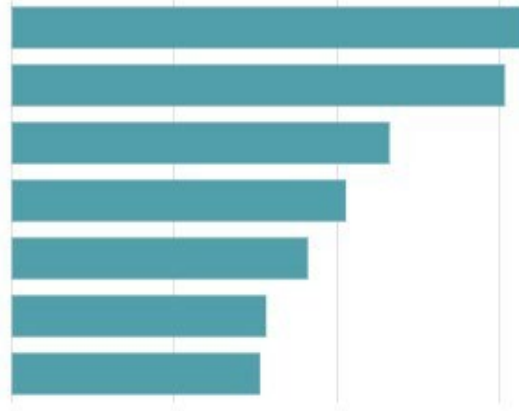

## What else has the design team learned from staff?

In addition to feedback on types of spaces, staff have also provided feedback on other items in the space, including:

- Staff receiving individual task lights at their desks
- Additional acoustic support to manage noise
- Headphones for staff in the more open spaces
- Toolbars with paper storage, pen storage, etc.
- Privacy screens for monitors where requested
- Types of outlets for the desktop power (USB, USB-C)
- **What happens next?**
- To truly work differently in the new building, we know this will be a change for many of us. With the concept floor coming to a close, the project team will now start to work closely with departments to create specific support plans for your teams to help you prepare for the change. These programs will help guide how to use the new tools, how to take advantage of the new spaces and best practices for high-rise operations.
- These projects will start roughly six months ahead of your move, with some starting in the next few months!

### This month's questions are:

*Q: I was told the 20th floor is under construction. Can we see some progress pictures?*

A: Yes, we are excited to share more progress pictures monthly moving forward.



*Q: We've heard a lot about the "408 permit." Can you explain what that is?*

A: Yes, a Section 408 permit is the process to alter a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) civil works project. In this case, that meant working with the USACE to design the Council chamber building and site changes to ensure the standard flood plan for the Trinity River region would remain unchanged, aiming to continue to keep the Fort Worth region as safe as possible.
