## **Safe City Improvements**

N Beach St & Alta Vista Rd was evaluated by engineering staff and the upgrade of the Stop Sign to 36 in x 36 in and stop sign ahead warning signage is recommended to improve traffic safety at the intersection. The new upgrade will be installed within 30 days. Timeline is contingent on weather conditions. Thank you to TPW and engaged constituents!

## **TxDOT News**

Double Eagle/FM 156 intersection: The signal study has determined that a traffic signal meets warrants at this location and will be installed. The timeline for a signal that meets warrants to then be designed, funded, materials fabricated and ultimately installed is about 12-18 months.
