"This week, I added my signature to proudly support and approve a \$20K increase in the Over 65 and Disability Residential Homestead Exemptions. Property tax relief is an issue that is top of mind in every household in our city, and this step will be incredibly meaningful to our many neighbors in vulnerable circumstances where every cent counts. This also builds upon the City's existing overall Homestead Exemption, which was already maxed out at 20%, and Tarrant County's newly-adopted 10% exemption. I look forward to continuing this effort to further reduce the property tax burden for all residents by working together along with City staff to pursue a tax rate reduction when we adopt the City's annual budget in the fall."
