# WELCOME!

#### **Dear Grownups:**

Thank you for registering your child for 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten! We applaud you; reading books with your child is a great investment in their future and provides a great opportunity for bonding. Reading together is fun and will create lifelong memories for both of you. Children who are exposed to more books more often, and who have positive literacy experiences with loving grownups, are receiving "the neurological groundwork for effective language use and literacy" (from the Child Mind Institute).

#### **Nuts and bolts**

- Read any book to your newborn, infant, toddler or preschooler.
- Log books in Beanstack or in this booklet.
- At each 100 books logged, visit your favorite Fort Worth Public Library location to receive a stamp.
- Pick up fun prizes after 250 books, 500 books, and 750 books.
- When you complete 1,000 books, your child will receive a medal.

It may sound difficult to read 1,000 books before kindergarten, but if you read just one book a night, you can finish in three years. You can count repeat readings, so if your little one needs to hear "Goodnight Goodnight Construction Site" three times before bed, that counts as three books. You can count any book your child hears, which includes books read by older siblings and other family members, and books read in library story times or at daycare.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### Who can participate in this program?

Any child from birth until entering kindergarten can participate in the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program.

#### How long will the program take?

The program will take anywhere from a few months to a few years. The program is self-paced and will depend on how often you read together.

#### How many of my children can participate?

All of them (provided they have not yet started kindergarten). Make it even more fun and read as a family!




Great books for toddlers include predictable books with repeating text, rhyming books, and vocabulary-building books.





Te aplaudimos; Leer libros con su hijo es una gran inversión en su futuro y brinda una gran oportunidad para establecer vínculos afectivos. Leer juntos es divertido y creará recuerdos para toda la vida para ambos. Los niños que están expuestos a más libros con más frecuencia y que tienen experiencias positivas de alfabetización con adultos amorosos, están recibiendo "las bases neurológicas para el uso efectivo del lenguaje y la alfabetización" (del Child Mind Institute).

#### **Tuercas y tornillos**

- Léale cualquier libro a su recién nacido, bebé, niño pequeño o preescolar.
- Registre los libros en Beanstack o en este folleto.
- Por cada 100 libros registrados, visite su ubicación favorita de la Biblioteca Pública de Fort Worth para recibir un sello.
- Obtenga premios divertidos después de 250 libros, 500 libros y 750 libros.
- Cuando complete 1000 libros, su hijo recibirá una medalla.

Puede parecer difícil leer 1000 libros antes del Kinder, pero si lees solo un libro por la noche, puedes terminarlo en tres años. Puede contar las lecturas repetidas, de modo que si su pequeño necesita escuchar "Buenas Noches, Buenas Noches, Sitio de Construcción" tres veces antes de acostarse, eso cuenta como tres libros. Puede contar cualquier libro que escuche su hijo, lo que incluye libros leídos por hermanos mayores y otros miembros de la familia, y libros leídos en la hora de cuentos de la biblioteca o en la guardería.

#### ¿Quién puede participar en este programa?

**LITERACY TIP** Songs help children develop listening skills, build vocabulary, hear the smaller parts of words, and pay attention to the rhythms and rhymes of spoken language. Combining the two skills, reading and singing, can also multiply the impact of the two on language development. Try singing a book with your child!







**Q LITERACY TIP** Read books with new words! The earlier a child hears a word, the more likely it is to stick. Hearing rare and unusual words read aloud makes them easier to recognize later, when learning to read.






**PLITERACY TIP** Pointing out the print in books helps build a foundation for reading mechanics. Try running your finger under some words as you read them. Point out the letters in your child's name, or if they are familiar, ask them to point them out.
