Development Council
(CDC) is an advisory board
made up of Fort Worth
residents just like you!

Official members apply and are then appointed by the Fort Worth City Council to represent their respective district. The CDC was established to assist the City Council in complying with federal grant requirements and setting priorities for projects that serve low and moderate income families in Fort Worth.

The CDC reviews applications for proposed community development and affordable housing projects, and makes recommendations for the funding of projects that align with the priorities set by the City Council.

That said, all members of the public are welcome to attend monthly CDC meetings and provide feedback.



ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

WHO

The Annual Action Plan (AAP) is drafted by the Planning and Reporting division of Neighborhood Services with direction from the public and then submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)

WHAT The AAP provides a detailed plan to meet the priorities and goals outlined in the Five-Year Consolidated Plan, and assist low-moderate income neighbors.

> Whereas the Consolidated Plan covers 5 years, the AAP focuses on the current grant year. The funding to meet the goals outlined in the Action Plan is provided to the City by HUD through the following programs:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME)
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)
- Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)

WHEN

The City of Fort Worth's AAP is drafted in the Spring, submitted to HUD in August, and implemented in the following program year (October 1- September 30)

WHERE The final Action Plan for the upcoming grant year can be found beginning in August on the City's website at: FortWorthTexas.gov/Departments/Neighborhoods/Grants

The projects and goals outlined in the AAP are completed through partnerships between the City and local Public Service Agencies (PSA's). These PSA's are selected through a competitive Request For Proposals (RFP) application process each year
