Section 3- Pruning restrictions

Pollarding, topping or lion tailing is not allowed on city trees. Pruning cuts shall be made according to ANSI A300 standards and companion publication Best Management Practices. Trees less than 24" DBH shall have no more than 33% of living canopy removed. Trees 24" DBH or greater shall have no more than 25% of living canopy removed. Crown to height ratio of 2/3 shall be maintained where possible. When thinning: retention of a dominant leader is required and preservation of outward branches shall be given preference over upward branches except in instances where they interfere with traffic. Pruning lateral branches greater than 1/3 diameter of trunk or remaining branch at point of attachment are to be avoided, instead using a reduction or subordinate cut and retaining the branch until such time as it is 1/3 diameter or less. Pruning paint must be used on all cuts on oaks between January and June. Pruning is to be made or supervised by an ISA Certified Arborist, or arborist of pre approved equivalent credentials.
