Tree Grant Project Evaluation Criteria and Water Restriction Guidelines

Tree Grant applications are evaluated on five criteria: 1) number of trees requested, 2) location of the proposed tree planting project, 3) level of partnership provided by the applicant, 4) need for trees, and 5) benefits provided by the trees received. Based on these criteria, each application may receive up to a total of 110 possible points. Additionally, up to 7 possible bonus points may be earned per applicant. The total point breakdown by criteria is detailed below.
