# ARCHITECTURAL HIGHLIGHT

Serving as a central hub for Gateway Park, the park facility building and amphitheater offer a flexible venue for events and gatherings. Large public bathrooms on the ground floor can easily accommodate gatherings of any size. Additionally, a covered balcony on the second floor offers a unique viewing experience of performances taking place in the amphitheater below.

### B Entry Monuments

The entry monuments serve as beacons, celebrating the approach to Gateway Park. Standing approximately 50 feet tall, they are visible from a distance and illuminated to become soft lanterns at night. The tall stone base references the park's geology while discouraging climbing and providing space for park signage. A concealed internal ladder facilitates easy maintenance and allows for the attachment of banners for special events.

### (C) Pavilion

Perched atop a hill, offering panoramic views of downtown Fort Worth, the pavilion provides a perfect spot to gather while soaking in the city's beauty. Whether hosting a birthday party or an impromptu performance, the pavilion's 1600 sqft of covered space can comfortably accommodate large groups. Its butterfly roof ingeniously directs rainwater down rain chains to retention troughs, showcasing the interaction of water between the pavilion and the park. This presents an ideal opportunity to educate student groups about ecology and the critical importance of conservation efforts.

### D Concession & Bathroom Buildings

The restrooms and concessions buildings offer a place of respite during a day of activities at the park. Large overhangs provide shade on sunny days and cover during a storm. The butterfly roof directs rainwater to a cistern for storage and use in irrigation around the building. Steel, stone, and wood were chosen as the materials for the structure, echoing the natural character of the surrounding environment and providing resilience against the natural elements and day-to-day use of the park by residents.
