3-Month Key Highlights

March

- March 10, 2023: Meeting at Martin Luther King Jr. Community Center
- March 13, 2023: Began evaluation of litter and illegal dump concerns
- March 14, 2023: Expanded weekly litter routes
- March 21, 2023: Community Tour
- March 27, 2023: Cleaned illegal camp sites/illegal dumping on Maxey St.
- March 30, 2023: Ensured property owner installed silt fence at 4800 Block of Parker Henderson Rd.



3-Month Key Highlights

April

- April 2, 2023: Prairie Dog Park special cleanup with Code & PARD
- April 3, 2023: Removed materials at 5600 Block of Parker Henderson Rd.
- April 12, 2023: Began initial field assessment for environmental conditions
- April 14, 2023: Submitted U.S. EPA Grant for \$1M to support efforts (City Council June 27th Agenda)

May

- May 3, 2023: Completed initial field assessment for environmental conditions
- Continued routine litter control/street sweeping, coordination with other City departments, and governmental partners








































Quadrant Model for Greater Impact

Days of week are adjusted for holiday and special event schedules.






Initial Environmental Assessment


- 3 Senior Environmental Specialists focused on <u>commercial / industrial</u> activity
- April 12 May 3, 2023
- Existing land activity within study area:
 - ~200 commercial parcels
 - ~15 industrial parcels

Environmental staff did not identify any environmental issues that were immediately dangerous to life or health.


Study Area








Initial Environmental Assessment

Visible air emission investigation	0
Visible sediment discharge investigation	2
Regulated waste management referral to TCEQ	3
Routine water quality inspection	15
Routine air quality inspection	7
Administrative permit verification	93



Next Steps

- 1. Evaluate options for air quality sampling with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
- 2. Monitor construction and industrial sites / activities to complete post-assessment action.
- 3. Continue to monitor area for litter and illegal dumping.
- 4. Continue to respond to Code Compliance requests.
