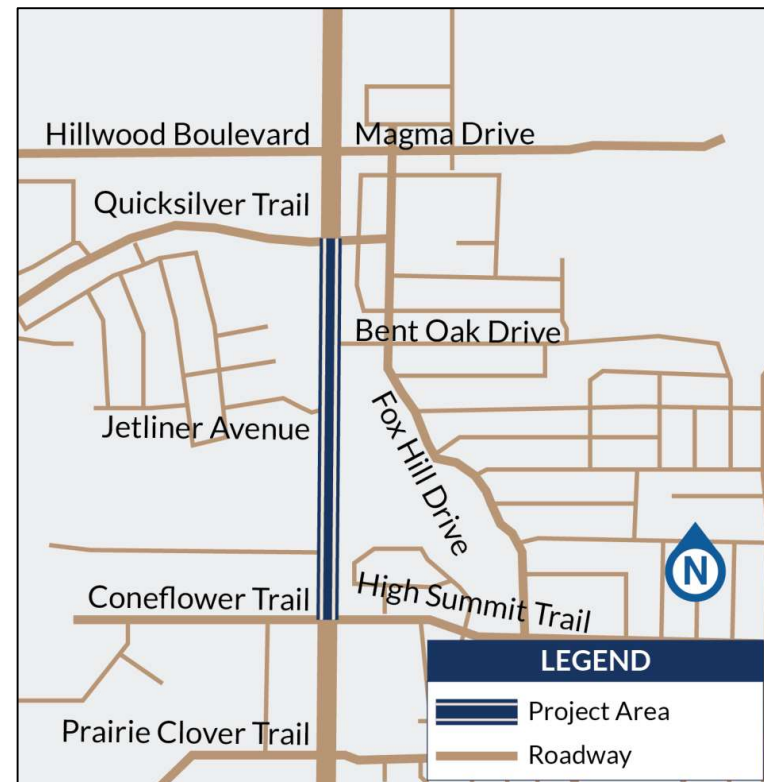

- Approximately one-half mile
- From Quicksilver Trail to Coneflower Trail
- City Council Districts 7 and 10
- Progressive Design-Build project



Project Details

- The project will involve the raising and widening of this section of Wagley Roberston Road (from Quicksilver Trail to Coneflower Trail) to a four-lane divided roadway with a concrete median.
- Additional features include:
 - Bike and pedestrian paths
 - New streetlights
 - New drainage systems
 - Floodplain and creek improvements

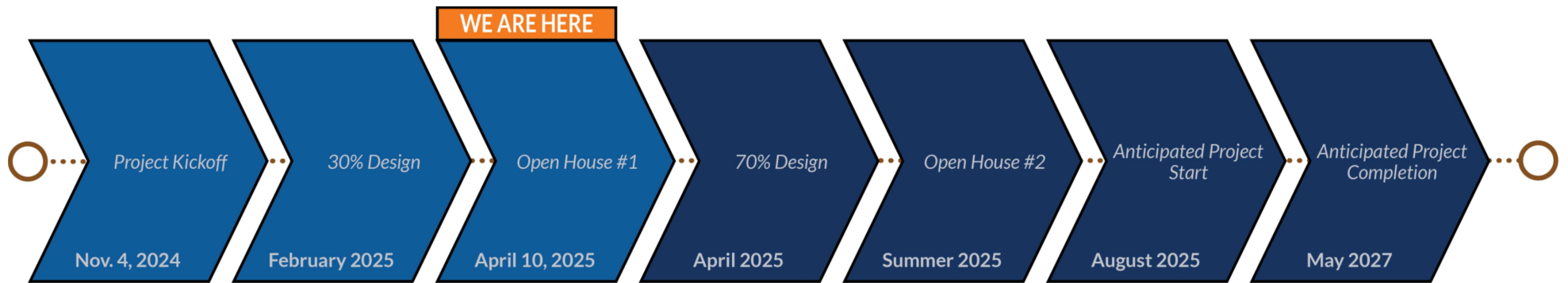


Project Details

 - Approximately \$25M
- Funding:
 - 2022 Bond Program
 - Transportation Impact Fees
 - Developer contributions



Anticipated Project Timeline

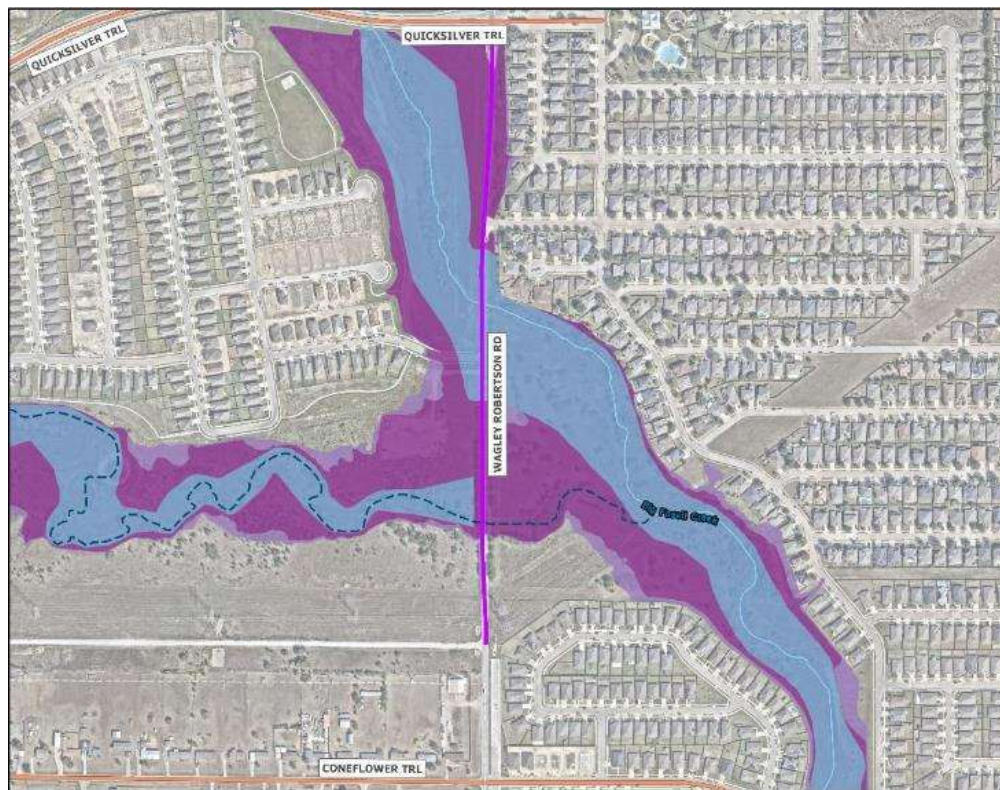


Dates are approximate and subject to change.

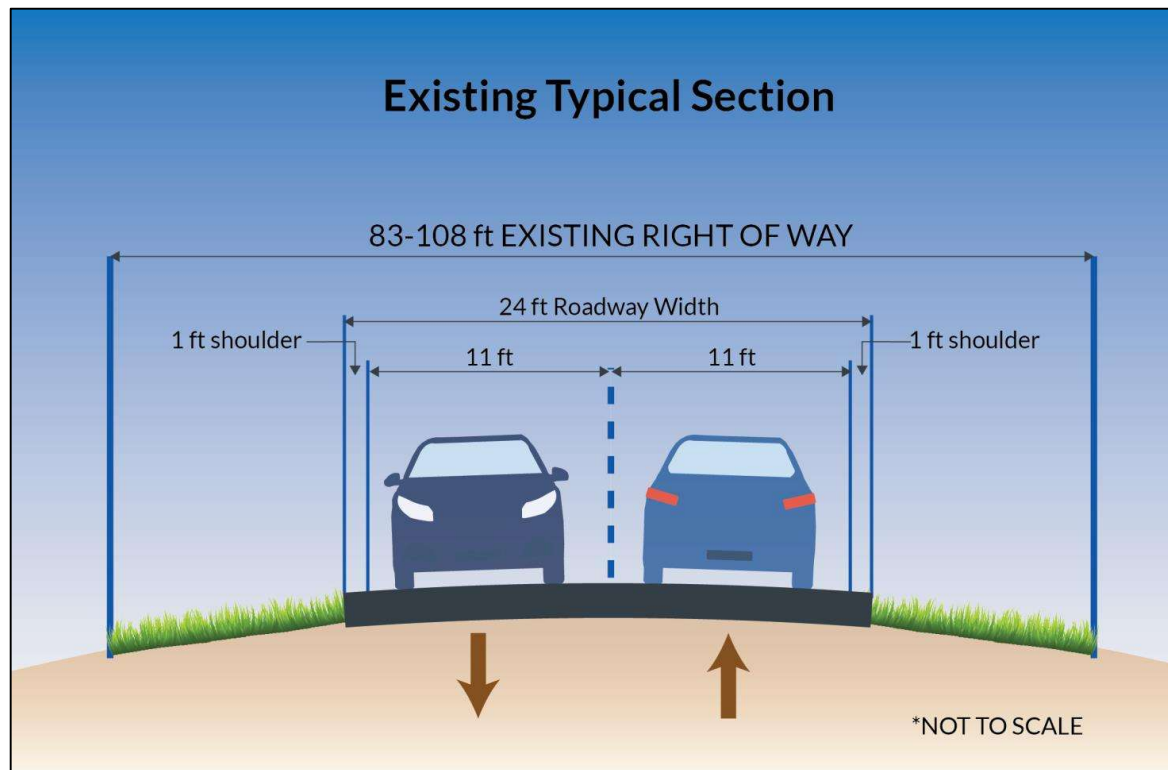
Why is this project needed?

- To raise the existing roadway out of the floodplain
- To expand the roadway to meet the growth demands
 - Existing is two lanes
 - Proposed is four lanes with shared-use path on either side
- To increase safety
 - Lighting
 - Concrete barriers

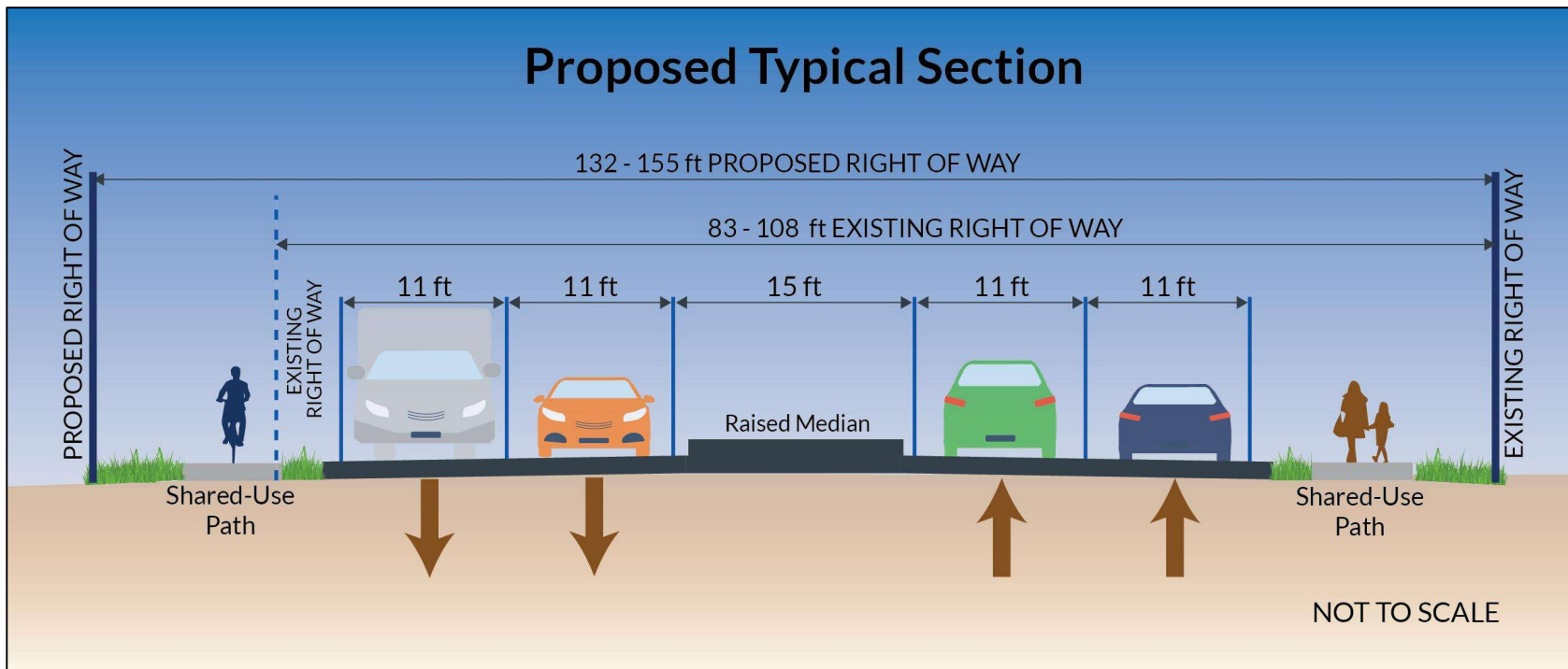
Floodplain Map



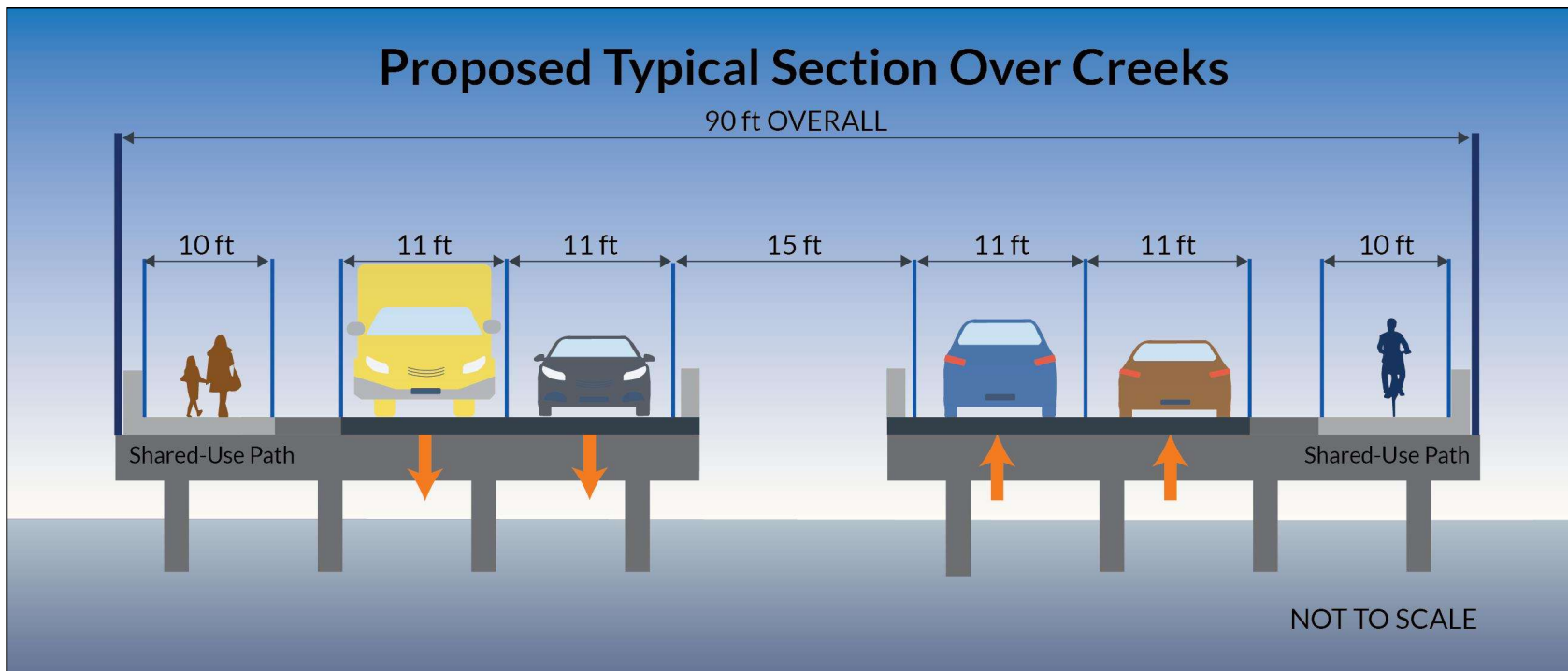
Existing Typical Section
