Open-Ended Questions & Comments

What current service outcomes are missing that are important to you as a ratepayer?

- That Storm Water would have more power over Zoning to keep flooding zones from having homes built on them just because we need homes for the population increase.
- How do you contain water onsite to slow down the water coming to the downstream neighbor also, draining a residential property correctly so the water flows to the street (requiring developers to provide a 'ridge' at the back of the property and water drain to the street and on property)
- All mentioned seem like a great and comprehensive overview of what could be worked on to better inform residents!
- Can't think of any right now. However, I would want some of these outcomes be tied to qualitative criteria.
