The Cowtown Great American cleanup is the organization's **Great American** largest annual litter cleanup and beautification event. Last year, approximately 4,900 people volunteered and removed more than 134,200 pounds of litter from the city.



Registration is open. The first 5,000 volunteers to register will receive a free event T-shirt and litter cleanup supplies.

Considering some smart spring upgrades? You may qualify for new toilets



If your home or business was built before 1994, you may be eligible for up to two free Kohler toilets through Fort Worth's SmartFlush Program. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency estimates that these high-efficiency toilets can help users save up to 13,000 gallons of water each year per toilet, reducing water waste and utility bills.

With three program options VOUCHER, CARE, and COMMERCIAL - residents can find the perfect fit for their household. Signing up is simple:

- Log in to the MyH2O portal to apply directly.
- Email the Conservation team at Water Conservation @ FortWorth Texas.gov for an application.
- Visit SaveFortWorthWater.org to apply instantly online.

Looking for more ways to conserve water? For eligible customers, homeowners can explore additional water conservation programs like SmartRepair or SmartPressure. These programs make it easier to manage water usage while maintaining a comfortable home.

Don't miss out on these valuable opportunities to improve your home and lower costs.



Since 2023, the City's Transportation & Public Works (TPW) Department has replaced poor-condition streetlights, poles and LED streetlights in Fort Worth neighborhoods. Solar conversions for The Parks of Deer Creek, Northbrook and Historic Carver Heights are complete. The remaining neighborhoods Como, Stop Six Sunrise Edition, Historic Stop Six, Stop Six Poly Oversight, Brentwood Oak Hills, Oakridge Terrace, Central Meadowbrook, The New Mitchell Boulevard, Wedgewood East, South Hemphill Heights, Overton South, Highland Hills, Westcreek Central, Polytechnic Heights, and Parker Essex Boaz — are scheduled to be complete by October 2026.
