

ORDINANCE 26-28781

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING IDENTIFIED PROVISIONS OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FORT WORTH (2015), AS AMENDED, TO REFLECT CHANGES IN THE FEES STATED IN THOSE CODE SECTIONS; ADDING NEW FEES AND CHANGING CERTAIN FEES AND RATIFYING AND CONTINUING PREVIOUSLY ESTABLISHED UNCODIFIED FEES; ALLOWING FOR CHANGES IN CERTAIN FEES DUE TO MARKET CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR DOCUMENTATION OF AMBULANCE-RELATED FEES SUBJECT TO ADJUSTMENT BASED ON FEDERAL DIRECTIVES; DESIGNATING OTHER DEPARTMENTS ACTING ON BEHALF OF THE FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE CUMULATIVE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, certain City functions are provided on a fee-for-service basis, with such fees designed to recover some or all of the costs incurred by the City to provide such services;

WHEREAS, adoption and revision of the utility rates for water and wastewater and for municipal drainage (stormwater) are subject to specific processes and are therefore handled by separate action in order to ensure compliance with those utility-rate-setting processes, but certain other non-rate miscellaneous fees are simply set by Council;

WHEREAS, in limited instances the fees for other non-utility City services are reflected in codified ordinances that can be found in the Code of the City of Fort Worth (2015), as amended;

WHEREAS, for a number of other fee-based services, the City Code simply refers to fees being set by City Council, which action may not take the form of an ordinance;

WHEREAS, the operations of the City's Public Events Department involve booking business for conventions and other gatherings at the Fort Worth Convention Center months or sometimes years in advance, necessitating the adoption of fees for such facilities beyond just the immediately coming year;

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the City Council will formally authorize (i) a 'lift assist' charge to recover a portion of the costs for non-emergency, non-medical services provided by the City's emergency medical services (EMS) personnel at institutional care facilities, and (ii) on-site sewer facility rates, and it is advisable to set the levels for those fees, subject to and conditioned on adoption of the City Code amendment, with imposition of such fees noted herein as being contingent on amendment of the City Code;

WHEREAS, certain EMS fees may legally only be increased by an amount equal to the lesser of (i) 10% of the current rates or (ii) a percentage inflation factor determined by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) with such changes to take effect January 1, 2027; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the City Council approve EMS fees at the rates reflected herein with the caveat that fees designated with an asterisk may be lowered based on CMS's determination and with a mechanism provided to memorialize the final rates after CMS issues its direction; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to improve transparency and facilitate locating the various uncodified fees, staff recommends adopting a single ordinance as part of the annual budget to reflect changes to codified fees *other than* utility rates for water and stormwater and changes to non-codified fees and to ratify all previously established fees that will continue to be charged for the coming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2026 budget, the City Council deems it appropriate to adopt this instrument to amend certain non-utility fee schedules in the City Code, to update the non-codified fee schedule as reflected herein, and to ratify all previously enacted uncodified fees.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WORTH, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1.

The following sections of the City Code of the City of Fort Worth are hereby amended in accordance with the attached Exhibit "A" to reflect changes in certain fees and associated language:

Chapter 35, Article III, Division 1, Section 35-57.4, “Water Tap Connections”; and

Chapter 35, Article III, Division 1, Section 35-57.4, “Sewer Tap Connections”

SECTION 2.

With the exception of Water and Wastewater utility rates charged by the Water Department and Municipal Drainage utility rates charged by the Stormwater Division of the Transportation and Public Works Department, all fees for the Aviation, Development Services, Environmental Services, Financial Management Services, Fire, Park and Recreation, Property Management, Public Events, Transportation and Public Works, and Water Departments beginning and effective October 1, 2026 shall be those previously authorized by City Council action and are ratified and shall continue to be in effect by the adoption of this Ordinance, save and except those fees where a change is being implemented as detailed on Exhibit “B” to this Ordinance, including changes to pre-existing fees and enactment of new fees, and all such fees and changes are hereby approved.

SECTION 3.

The Aviation, Development Services, Environmental Services, Financial Management Services, Fire, Park and Recreation, Property Management, Public Events, Transportation and Public Works, and Water Departments operate facilities and programs that compete with public and private sector facilities for business and periodically need to make adjustments in response to market demands and for promotional and educational purposes. Approval of this Ordinance authorizes the Directors of the departments identified above (or their designees) to adjust or waive fees in response to market demands, including, but not limited to, seasonal, weather-related, and facility condition-driven factors; customer service resolutions; memberships; advertising opportunities; special marketing promotions; and educational purposes. In addition, to the extent any City-owned facility is managed or operated by a non-profit support group, the Director of the department having responsibility for such facility may exercise the discretion to adjust fees by acting in concert with such non-profit organization. The maximum amount of fees will continue to be capped at those amounts previously approved by the City Council.

SECTION 4.

Certain fees for providing emergency medical services (EMS) established in Exhibit B are subject to limitation by the ambulance inflation factor (AIF) prescribed by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) and could be reduced. Following CMS’s pronouncement of AIF, staff in the Fire Department is directed to complete a notice to Council in substantially the form laid out in Exhibit C to memorialize the final fees as modified by CMS’s AIF and to file a copy thereof with the Fort Worth City Secretary as an addendum to this Ordinance.

SECTION 5.

Approval of this Ordinance will also officially designate other personnel and departments as acting on behalf of the Financial Management Services (FMS) Department in collecting fees and issuing licenses, as applicable. The City Charter charges the City's Finance Department "with the administration of the financial affairs of the city, including the keeping and supervision of all accounts and the issuance of licenses and the collection of license fees." As the City has grown over the years, responsibilities for issuing licenses and collecting fees became decentralized, with various departments and personnel being assigned as reflected in the City's revenue manual. In connection with the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2016 budget, the City Council approved M&C G-18545 (September 15, 2015), which formally designated the assigned personnel and departments to act on behalf of FMS in collecting fees and issuing licenses, where applicable. Adoption of this Ordinance continues that designation through Fiscal Year 2027.

SECTION 6.

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances and of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances and such Code, in which event conflicting provisions of such ordinances and such Code are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are severable, and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

SECTION 8.

All rights and remedies of the City of Fort Worth, Texas, are expressly saved as to any and all violations of any previously existing ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance, and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such ordinances, same shall not be affected by this ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 9.

This Ordinance shall take effect on October 1, 2026 and after publication as required by law, if necessary, with certain fees having later effective dates or being subject to certain preconditions as indicated herein.

Chapter 12.5, Article VIII, Division 4, Section 12.5-844 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

§ 12.5-844 NON CITY WASTE LANDFILL ENVIRONMENTAL FEE.

All persons disposing of non city waste at the Southeast Landfill who do have a current, valid Grant of Privilege Agreement with the city pursuant to §12.5-850 and/or do possess a current, valid hauling permit pursuant to §12.5-857 shall pay a Landfill Environmental Fee of \$7.00 per ton. All persons disposing of non city waste at the Southeast Landfill who do not have a current, valid Grant of Privilege Agreement with the city pursuant to § 12.5-850 and/or do not possess a current, valid hauling permit pursuant to §12.5-857 shall pay a Landfill Environmental Fee of \$13.00 per ton. The Landfill Environmental Fee shall be collected with the tipping fee assessed by the operator of the Southeast Landfill.

VI.

Chapter 12.5, Article IX, Division 2, Section 12.5-865 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

§ 12.5-865 REGISTRATION.

(a) Except as provided in § 12.5-870, no fill material may be placed on any tract, parcel or platted lot within the city limits unless a valid registration and site map is filed with the development services department of the city, the registration fee in the amount of \$178.00 is paid to the city, notification is provided to all applicable property owners within 300 feet of the property and registered neighborhood associations within one-quarter mile of the property, and a sign is posted on the property as required by this article.

(b) All registrations must be renewed annually with city prior to the expiration of the current registration, but shall be exempted from the notice requirements of this chapter.

(c) Placement of fill material is used for landscaping purposes on improved property is exempted from the requirements of this section.

VII.

Chapter 13, Article I, Section 13-2, "Amendments," Section H104 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

SECTION H104

FEES FOR INSPECTIONS AND OPERATIONAL PERMITS

H104.1 General. Fees for fire inspections and operational permits will be in accordance with Section 104 of this Appendix. Fees for the inspection of mobile home and recreational vehicle parking facilities will be in accordance with Appendix J of this code.

H104.2 Fees for fire inspections. A fire inspection fee will be charged not more than once per calendar year for a fire inspection of all occupancies requiring a Certificate of Inspection as set forth in Section 102 of this Appendix. These fees shall be paid before a Certificate of Inspection is issued. The fees for fire inspection will be the sum of the base fee as set forth in Table H104.1 and the multiple-story fee as set forth in H104.2.1.

H104.2.1 Multiple-story fee. An additional fee of \$10.00 per floor will be added to the base fee for inspection of buildings with four or more occupied floors above the street level.

H104.2.2 Shopping malls. Shopping malls shall be assessed an inspection fee based on total floor area of the public areas within the structure plus the per story charge. The individual tenant spaces will be assessed fees based on the square footage of the individual space.

H104.3 Fees for operational permits. The fee for all operational permits will be as set forth in Table H104.2. Fees for Mobile Fueling Permits will be in accordance with Appendix K.

VIII.

Chapter 13, Article I, Section 13-2, "Amendments," Section H105 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

SECTION H105

FEES FOR FALSE ALARMS

H105.1 General. Fees will be assessed to commercial establishments for excessive false alarms in accordance with Section 105 of this Appendix.

H105.2 Definitions. For the purpose of this Appendix the following definitions shall apply in addition to those in Section 202, General Definitions, and Section 902, Definitions, of the Fire Code.

H105.2.1 False alarm. For the purpose of this section, a false alarm is defined as an alarm which causes the emergency response by the fire department and which is initiated by one of the following:

1. A fire alarm system malfunction.
2. Improper maintenance of a fire alarm or an automatic fire suppression system.
3. Improper use or misuse of a fire alarm system or an automatic fire suppression system.
4. Damage to a fire alarm system or automatic fire suppression system due to carelessness while performing other procedures in the building.
5. The initiation of a fire alarm system during construction, painting, or other procedure in which care should have been taken to protect initiating devices from sending a false signal.

H105.3 Procedure. The procedure used to assess false alarm complaints and application of the fees contained herein will be in accordance with Section H105.3.

H105.3.1 Review of Incident Reports. False alarm incidents will be reviewed by the Fire Prevention Bureau on a regular basis to determine if those incidents meet the criteria stated in Section H105.2.1 of this Appendix.

H105.3.2 Notification. Upon the review of a false alarm incident report, a member of the Fire Prevention Bureau will verify the validity of the complaint. The owner or manager of the premises in question will then be issued a written notice to take measures to correct any problem that may be causing the false alarms. The notice will state that future false alarms at the referenced address, which occur within twelve months of the original complaint, will cause the owner or manager of the establishment to be invoiced in accordance with Section 105.4 of this Appendix, Fees.

H105.3.3 Invoice for false alarms. An invoice will be mailed to any establishment for all reported false alarms which occur after the written notification in accordance with Section 105.3.2 of this Appendix is issued, and which occur before a period of twelve months has passed since the written notification. The invoice will be in accordance with Section 105.4 of this Appendix, Fees.

H105.4 Fees. A fee in accordance with Table H105.1 will be assessed for each false alarm reported to the Fire Prevention Bureau after written notification is issued in accordance with Section 105.3.2 of this Appendix.

J401.1 An annual fee is hereby charged to the owner of each manufactured home park and recreational vehicle park located within the city, to provide for inspections by the fire code official to determine compliance with the requirements of the Fire Code and of the requirements of this appendix relative to fire safety.

J401.1.1 Calculation of inspection fee. The annual inspection fee for inspections required by this section are calculated as the total of the following:

- a. Base fee of **\$235.00**.
- b. Additional fee of \$5.50 per individual lot within the park.

XIII.

Chapter 29, Article V, Division 2, Section 5.01 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

SECTION 5.01: REGISTRATION OF OFF-PREMISES SIGNS

5.01 REGISTRATION OF OFF-PREMISE SIGNS.

(a) (1) The owner of any off-premises sign existing within the City of Fort Worth on November 5, 1997, shall register such sign with the building official and pay the registration fee as required in Table 5.01 on or before January 2, 1998. The owner of any off-premises sign in the extraterritorial jurisdiction shall register such sign with the building official and pay the registration fee as required in Table 5.01 on or before October 1, 2000.

(2) Exceptions: Signs listed in § 6.402 of the zoning ordinance or § 5.02.2 and signs subject to a unified sign agreement shall be exempt from the registration requirements.

(b) (1) The owner of any off-premise sign installed after November 5, 1997, shall submit an application for registration simultaneously with the sign permit application. This initial registration shall be exempt from the registration fee as required in Table 5.01. If the sign permit is approved and the sign constructed, this initial registration shall expire three years after the date of permit application.

(2) Exceptions: Signs listed in § 6.402 of the zoning ordinance and signs subject to a unified sign agreement shall be exempt from the registration requirements.

(c) (1) Registrations approved under subsections (a) and (b) above and all renewals shall expire after three years. Before such registration or renewal expires the registration must be renewed and the registration fee must be paid in accordance with Table 5.01. It is the owner's responsibility to monitor expiration dates and to renew the registration in a timely manner.

(2) Exceptions: Based upon staffing and work loads, the building official may adjust expiration dates to be less than three years as long as the fees are appropriately prorated.

(d) (1) Registration shall be applied for on forms provided by the building official. The building official may require the filing of plans or other pertinent information when, in his or her opinion, such information is necessary to ensure compliance with this section.

(2) Whenever information on the form changes, including but not limited to names and addresses, a new registration form shall be filled out by the owner and submitted to the building official within 30 days, along with a change of record fee as required by Table 5.01.

(e) (1) A late fee shall be assessed against the owners of off-premises signs who fail to register as required by this section. The late fee as shown in Table 5.01 shall be assessed if the registration fee is not received within ten calendar days after the due date.

(2) Failure to register or renew registration of a sign within 30 calendar days after the due date in accordance with the provisions of this section shall constitute a violation of this code.

XIV.

Chapter 30, Article I, Division 2, Section 30-14 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

§ 30-14 PAINTING HOUSE NUMBERS ON CURBS OR DRIVEWAYS—LICENSE AND BOND REQUIRED; LICENSE FEE; PERMISSION FROM PROPERTY OWNERS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to paint or print any house number or street address on any curb or driveway approach within the city without first having obtained, from the city's department of transportation and public works, a license to do such work, having made and executed a bond to the city in the sum of \$500, having paid a license fee of \$29.53 and having obtained from the owner, lessee or other person responsible for the premises written permission and approval, which shall state the price to be paid, both to paint or print the number of the curb or driveway approach and to obliterate, mark out, damage or otherwise remove any existing markings on the curb.

XV.

Chapter 30, Article II, Section 30-32 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows

§ 30-32 LICENSE; BOND; PERMIT.

It shall be unlawful for any person or firm to perform the work of a parkway contractor, as defined in this article, without first having obtained from the director of public works a license to

do such work, having made and executed a bond to the city in the sum of \$10,000, without having obtained a parkway contractor's license, the fee for which shall be \$591.00, and without having obtained a permit from the director of public works to do such work. The license provided for in this article shall be renewed annually, and the renewal fee shall be \$591.00.

XVI.

Chapter 35, Article III, Division 1, Section 35-57.4 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

§ 35-57.4 WATER TAP CONNECTIONS.

(a) *City installed tap.* In the case where the city installs a two-inch or smaller water tap, a charge shall be made for each tap made to a water main. The charges shall be payable by the property owner prior to the tap being made and shall be as follows:

(b) *City installed tap within asphalt pavement.* Any tap connection performed within an asphalt street constructed more than two years prior to the proposed tap connection will be assessed an additional charge associated with the age and pavement condition index (PCI) as adopted by the city council.

(c) *Taps within new pavement.* Proposed tap connections within concrete or asphalt pavement less than two years of age will not be performed by the city and will be required to be made under a Community Facilities Agreement (CFA) between the customer and the city.

(d) *Other taps.* Any tap connection larger than two inches, or involving unusual circumstances, shall be made through the Community Facilities Agreement process between the customer and the city or through the city's Miscellaneous Contracts.

(1) *Community Facilities Agreement.* The customer shall comply with the requirements of the CFA process and pavement repair in accordance with the city's Utility Construction Policy.

(2) *Miscellaneous contract.* At the discretion of the city, tap installations may be eligible to be performed through the city's Miscellaneous Contracts. Any installations requiring excavation in a newly paved street (within two years of age) are not eligible for the Miscellaneous Contract process. Construction within the city's Downtown Central Business District are not eligible for the Miscellaneous Contract process unless granted prior approval from the Water Department Director. The Miscellaneous Contract may be used for the following types of infrastructure:

- a. Fire line taps;
- b. Water service lines two-inches, or smaller; and
- c. Water service taps greater than two-inches. Three-inches and greater will require a meter vault in accordance with standard details.

(e) *New developments.* Developers shall pay the full cost of all water service taps constructed by contract in new developments through a CFA.

(f) *Pavement removal.* In the case that installation of a water tap connection requires the removal of pavement, the city and/or pre-qualified contractor will abide by the city's Utility Construction Policy for all pavement cuts or excavations within the city right-of-way and easements. All construction must be in accordance with city standard construction specifications. All pre-planned utility construction within city right-of-way, including drainage or other applicable easements, requires a Street Use Permit for Utility Construction ("Permit") prior to construction.

(g) *Other fee.* The tap charges shall be in addition to the applicable fees provided for in the city plumbing code and in any other city codes, including, but not limited to, impact fees.

(h) *Violations.* Any service connection made in violation of the City Code may be removed at the property owner's expense.

(i) *Ownership and maintenance.*

(1) The water tap and service line installation shall be constructed at the expense of the property owner/customer. The city shall then be the owner of the tap and service line.

(2) The city shall maintain water service connections from the main to the meter.

(j) *Tap removal.* The permanent removal or abandonment of a water service line or meter may be performed under a Community Facilities Agreement (CFA), Miscellaneous Projects or the city and comply with city's Utility Construction Policy.

(1) The city shall not perform a removal of a tap within concrete or asphalt pavement less than two years of age and will be required to be made under a Community Facilities Agreement.

(2) If the tap removal request is through the city, a removal fee as shown below shall be due and payable to the city prior to the tap being removed. Any tap connection removed within an asphalt street constructed more than two years prior to the proposed tap connection will be assessed an additional charge associated with the age and pavement condition index (PCI) as adopted by the City Council in accordance with the city's Utility Construction Policy.

Chapter 35, Article III, Division 1, Section 35-57.4 of the Code of the City of Fort Worth, Texas (2015), as amended, is amended in its entirety to be and read as follows:

§ 35-57.5 SEWER TAP CONNECTIONS.

(a) *City installed tap.* The city may install sewer taps eight-inches, or smaller, with a depth not exceeding eight feet of cover. The property owner and or customer shall pay a charge as detailed below for any sanitary sewer tap installed by the city prior to the tap being made.

(b) *Manhole requirement.* All sewer taps greater than four-inch require connection to an existing or installed manhole and shall be contracted and paid for by the customer. If a connection to an existing manhole cannot be made, an additional charge of \$4,500 shall be payable by the property owner for the new manhole installation.

(c) *City installed tap within asphalt pavement.* Any tap connection performed within an asphalt street constructed more than two years prior to the proposed tap connection will be assessed an additional charge associated with the age and pavement condition index (PCI) as adopted by the city council in accordance with the city's Utility Construction Policy.

(d) *Taps within new pavement.* Proposed tap connections within concrete or asphalt pavement less than two years of age will not be performed by the city and will be required to be made under a CFA between the customer and the city.

(e) *Other taps.* Any sanitary sewer tap involving unusual conditions, connections to the city's deep sewer system, connections to mains exceeding eight feet of depth, or taps larger than eight inches shall be made through the Community Facilities Agreement process between the customer and city or through the city's Miscellaneous Contracts.

(1) *Community Facilities Agreement.* The customer shall comply with the requirements of the CFA process and pavement repair in accordance with the city's Utility Construction Policy.

(2) *Miscellaneous contract.* At the discretion of the city, tap installations may be eligible to be performed through the city's Miscellaneous Contracts. Any installations requiring excavation in a newly paved street (within two years of age) are not eligible for the Miscellaneous Contract process. Construction within the city's Downtown Central Business District are not eligible for the Miscellaneous Contract process unless granted prior approval from the Water Department Director. The Miscellaneous Contract may be used for any size of sewer tap where the depth of cover does not exceed 12 feet.

(f) *New developments.* Developers shall pay the full cost of all sewer service taps constructed by contract in new developments through a CFA.

(g) *Pavement removal.* In the case that installation of a sewer tap connection requires the removal of pavement, the city and/or pre-qualified contractor will abide to the city's Utility Construction Policy for all pavement cuts or excavations within the City of Fort Worth rights of way (ROW) and easements. All construction must be in accordance with city standard construction specifications. All pre-planned utility construction within city right-of-way, including drainage or other applicable easements, requires a Street Use Permit for Utility Construction ("Permit") prior to construction.

(h) *Other fees.* The tap charges shall be in addition to the applicable fees provided for in the city plumbing code and in any other city codes, including, but not limited to, impact fees.

(i) *Grade verification.* Prior to any construction of a building sewer lateral, the property owner shall verify in writing that the sewer lateral is capable of being installed to such a grade that will permit a sanitary sewer tap to be made by the city and that will meet all applicable city codes. Verification will be made by a drawing depicting the grade of the sanitary sewer lateral and the elevation of the sanitary sewer tap. In the absence of such verification, that portion of any building sewer to be constructed by the plumber or the person securing the permit shall not be constructed prior to the completion of the sanitary sewer tap by the water department forces.

(j) *Violations.* Any service connection made in violation of the City Code shall be removed at the property owner's expense.

(k) *Ownership and maintenance.*

(1) The sanitary sewer tap shall be constructed at the expense of the owner/customer. The city shall then own and maintain the sewer tap upon completion and acceptance.

(2) The city shall maintain wastewater service connections from the main to the property line.

(l) *Tap removal.* When a property owner requests permanent removal or abandonment of a sanitary sewer service line, then the tap removal shall be made through the Community Facilities Agreement process between the customer and city or through the city's Miscellaneous Contracts. The city shall not perform any sewer tap removal.

(1) *Community Facilities Agreement.* The customer shall comply with the requirements of the CFA process and pavement repair in accordance with the city's Utility Construction Policy.

(2) *Miscellaneous Contract.* At the discretion of the city, tap removal may be eligible to be performed through the city's Miscellaneous Contracts. Any installations requiring excavation in a newly paved street (within two years of age) are not eligible for the Miscellaneous Contract process. Construction within the city's Downtown Central Business District are not eligible for the Miscellaneous Contract process unless granted prior approval from the Water Department Director. The Miscellaneous Contract may be used for any sewer tap removal where the depth of cover does not exceed 12 feet.
