Compliance Corner

In January, Fort Worth launched the Nuisance Enforcement Task Force, or NET Force, a multi-departmental program targeting persistent nuisance properties. Joint inspections began at Sandy Oaks Apts. and expanded to the Eco Motel and the Southside Food Mart/Rocky's II. Teams from Code Compliance, Animal Care, Police, Fire, Environmental & Development Services conducted coordinated inspections, identifying more than 1,000 violations across the three locations.
