Compliance Corner

Six months after launching the pilot NET Force program, the City has made significant progress addressing persistent nuisance properties. More than 1,450 violations were identified across three target locations, with Sandy Oaks Apartments reaching full compliance and the Southside Food Market closing following enforcement actions. Eco Motel has been declared a hazardous property. The initiative has also led to additional arrests and improved neighborhood safety.
