#### **Ongoing Neighborhood Projects Include:**

- Smiley Park, is a .674 acre of land at South Riverside Drive and East Maddox Avenue, donated by Dalton's Best Maid Products Inc. The park is expected to include an active zone playground featuring crawling mounds, playscape for climbing and swinging, as well as play equipment for toddlers.
- Construction is set for early 2025 with completion by December 2025.



# Transforming Communities, One Block at a Time



SELECTION

#### The city makes an investment in the target neighborhood to promote growth

We use data and feedback to choose one or more neighborhoods for improvement and rehabilitation.



#### Level up with Resident-Driven **Rehabilitation Projects**

Based on what resident feedback, the program can focus on:

- · Improve pubic gathering places, such as: Parks, Community Centers and Libraries
- · Initiate projects to make the neighborhood more attractive
- · Add or enhancing existing green spaces with trees, and landscaping
- Work to slow down traffic
- Gather residents input about their future priorities



#### Plan, Engage & Listen to Residents

A few examples of how we can work to improve neighborhoods:

- · Clean up trash and illegal dumping
- Trim overgrown plants
- Clear alleyways
- Enforce codes based on residents' wishes
- Increased police presence
- · Fixing basic gaps, such as internet service
- · Seek residents input for next year and beyond
