Note to Parents

Thank you for your interest in the Rising Stars Youth Leadership Academy.

We have an enrollment limit of students, and your child has been selected to be part of this very special group of youth leaders.

This packet and orientation will provide you with information related to the program and answer questions you may have.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

Walking

Parents may allow their child to walk home at the end of the program by completing the required form during registration. Children permitted to walk home must sign out, leave the premises, and not hang out around the facility. **Participant Driving Self**

Parents must inform staff of participants that have a driver's license and will be transporting themselves to the program. Other youth participants will not be allowed to leave with anyone other than an authorized pick-up person. Participants that are driving may not provide rides to other participants without written or verbal consent from the parent/quardian.

Authorized pick-up

An authorized sibling, 16 years of age or older, may pick up a participant. Authorized siblings may not provide rides to other participants without written or verbal consent from the parent/guardian. Additionally, a code word has been added to verify that an individual **NOT** listed as an authorized pickup person has parental permission to pick up a participant



PROGRAM OVERVIEW AND BACKGROUND

Rising Stars Youth Leadership Academy is a leadership-based, academically enriched program. It emphasizes the development of hands-on leadership training, career development, life skills, and problem-solving skills for youth 12-18 years of age. Rising Stars helps students prepare for careers in various fields; medical training, civic/community engagement, leadership, journalism, technology, engineering, and more.

Rising Stars is a year-round program in which students can re-apply each year. A certificate of leadership and community service recognition will be awarded to each student upon completion.

Youth participants are engaged in interactive sessions and learn firsthand about community issues. They will be educated on opportunities to expand their knowledge of career opportunities and interact with leaders in and around Tarrant County.

Youth will develop the ability to analyze their own strengths & weaknesses, set personal and vocational goals, and develop self-esteem, confidence, motivation, and the ability to achieve success and the resilience to overcome challenges.

WARNING: Failure to comply with rules may result in immediate dismissal from the program.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

It is important that participants arrive on time. To fully benefit from the program, it requested that students have no more than three absences.

- Participants may **NOT** leave the meeting area, field trip venue, or group during the sessions until dismissal time. □
- Early dismissal is allowed with verbal or written consent from a parent/guardian. □

ABSENCE

Please notify the program coordinator if you are going to be absent via email, phone call, or text. Leave the student's name and the date they will be absent or late.

VISITORS

Visitors are not allowed. Only program participants will be allowed to participate in program activities. Exceptions for visitors are interested guests (parents, siblings, friends, etc.), which must have prior permission to visit the program and require necessary liability forms.

BOOKS/MANUALS

All books and manuals issued to you must be returned at the end of the program to receive your graduation certificate. You will be notified when you are allowed to keep materials.

DRESS CODE

- Caps and beanies are allowed if worn as part of the outfit but must be removed during presentations/public speaking.
- All shirts must have a minimum of 2-inch straps on both sides of the shirt. No spaghetti straps. No t-shirts or muscle shirts. Shirts must fully cover the torso, front, and back. Crop tops and half shirts are prohibited.
- Pants and shorts must not be too tight or too loose. No Sagging Pants. Pants must be worn at the waist. A belt is required if pants are loose. Shorts and skirts, when standing, must be no more than 2 inches above the knees.
- Tennis shoes should be worn when engaging in physical activities.
 - House shoes/Crocs/slippers/slides are not allowed.



CONDUCT

Proper conduct is REQUIRED at all times.

i.e., Loud noises, excessive talking, use of profanity, or congregating in unauthorized areas is not allowed. ☐

- RESPECT MUST BE SHOWN AT ALL TIMES TOWARD EVERYONE. Be respectful of others' personal space and opinions. This includes but is not limited to the following:
- People: All staff, guest speakers/presenters, special guests, and ALL PARTICIPANTS. Respect is shown to other people by not talking while others are speaking, paying attention when others are speaking, raising your hand to ask relevant questions/comments, or politely bringing attention to yourself to ask a relevant question ("Excuse me, I have a question/comment."), not making fun of what others say, introducing yourself when appropriate. Participants must remain engaged during presentations (sitting up straight, taking notes, not talking, etc.) Participants should not sleep, text, or display any other distracting behavior.
- **Spaces:** Facilities where meetings and/or activities are held, are to be left clean. You are responsible for picking up after yourself. Pick up all paper or other trash off the tables and floors. Restrooms are to be left as found. Ensure that trash is placed inside receptacles. Do not leave your seat or space with any trash/mess.
- Use of alcohol, all types of smoking or vaping, and drug use are prohibited.
- Electronic devices□
 - Electronic devices can only be used during breaks.
 - Electronic devices cannot be used during sessions unless discussed with the coordinator first.
 - Phones and electronic devices must be placed on silent or turned off. These include but are not limited to the following: Smartphones/cell phones, iPods/mp3 players, portable gaming devices (PSP, Nintendo Switch, etc.).
