SUBJECT: PEER TAX RATE COMPARISON

This budget response provides a comparison of the proposed tax rates and exemptions between Fort Worth and its peer cities, as compared to the prior year. The following two tables compare Fort Worth to the top ten DFW Metroplex cities by population and the top ten Texas cities by population, including the current exemption amounts. The rates presented below are categorized by the tax year, not the fiscal year. The 2021 rates reported below are the entity's adopted rates; the 2022 rates reported are the entity's current proposed rates for FY2023.

^{*}Houston increased its Over 65 and Disabled Person Exemptions from \$160,000 to \$260,000 for the 2022 Tax Year as of June 8, 2022.

^{**}San Antonio increased its Homestead Exemption from .01% to 10%, its Over 65 and Disabled Person Exemptions from \$65,000 to \$85,000, and its Disabled Person Exemptions from \$12,500 to \$72,500 for the 2022 Tax Year.

^{***}Dallas increased its Over 65 and Disabled Person Exemptions from \$107,000 to \$115,000 for the 2022 Tax Year.

^{****}El Paso increased its Over 65 and Disabled Person Exemptions from \$40,000 to \$42,500 for the 2022 Tax Year.
