A. Selection Process

- The City reserves the right to reject any or all submittals “nonresponsive”
- Evaluation Committee to score only responsive proposals
- Short-listed interviews (if needed), in-person or virtually
 - Tentatively: Thursday, September 6, 2023 or Friday, September 7, 2023 and will determine the top-ranked firm
- Five (5) days minimum notice for shortlisted interviewees

B. Proposal Requirements

1. Cover Letter and Executive Summary (not to exceed 3 pages in total)
 - Cover letter (1 page)
 - Executive summary of two (2) pages or less
2. Approach and Process (not to exceed 6 pages front and back)
3. Responsibility and Qualifications (not to exceed 5 pages front and back)
4. Prior Experience (not to exceed 5 pages front and back)
5. References (1 page)
 - Two (2) of the three (3) should be public sector clients
6. Budget - \$2,200,000.00
7. Minority/Women Business Enterprise (WBE) (MBE)/Goals 15%
8. Conflict of Interests Form

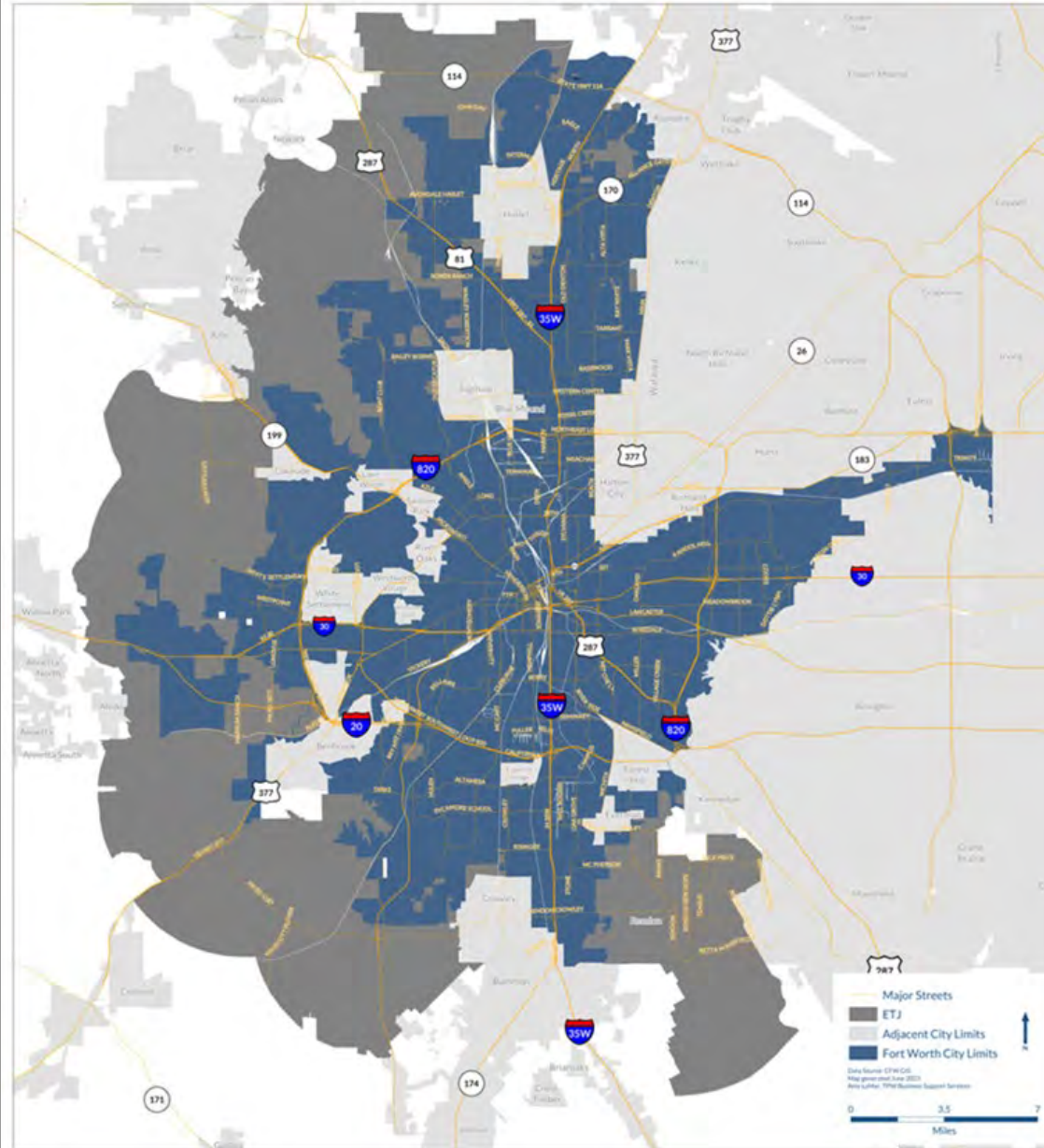
C. Proposal

 - Project Management/Availability of Consultant(s) – 30 points
 - Work Quality and References - 15 points
 - Additional Services, Ideas, Innovation or Products - 5 points
- Interview Points (if needed*) – 25 points

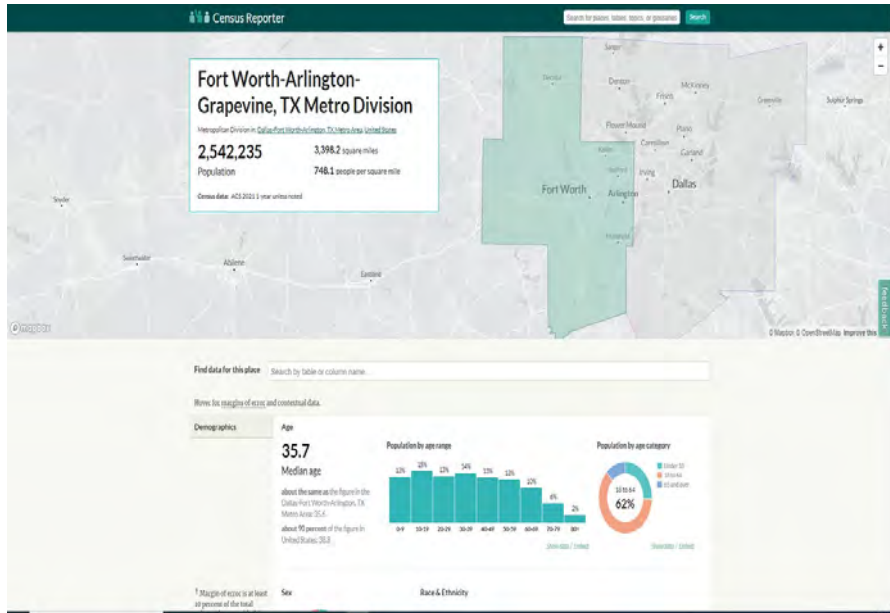

Cities with the largest numeric increase in population from 2021 to 2022



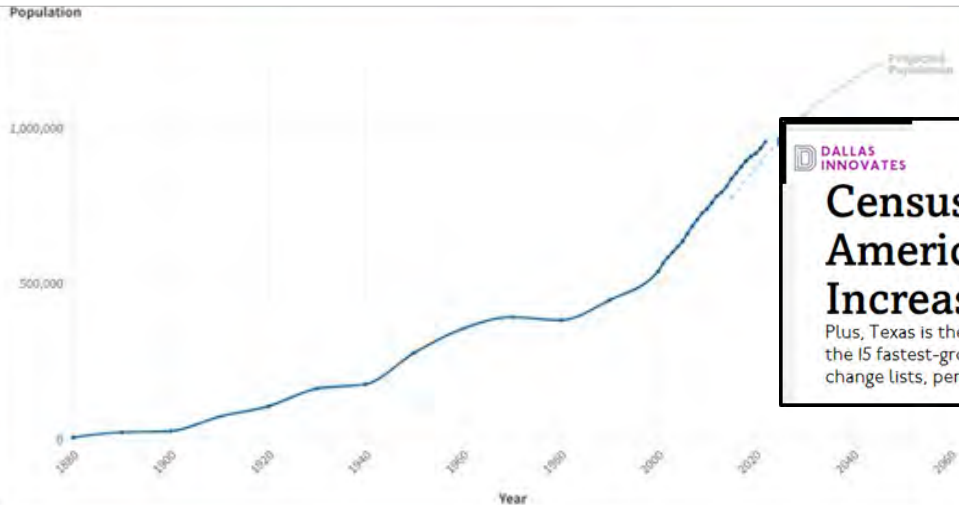

Population

According to U.S. Census Bureau estimates:

- Fort Worth's population was **956,709** as of July 1, 2022.
- Fort Worth is the **13th largest** city in the United States by population.
- Of all cities over 50,000 people, Fort Worth had the **largest gain in population** in the past year, adding 19,170 people (approximately 53 people per day).
- Of the top 30 most populous cities, Fort Worth is the **fastest growing**, at 4.1% population growth since 2020.
- Of the top 30 most populous cities, Fort Worth ranks 24th in terms of population density (only Oklahoma City, Jacksonville, Nashville-Davidson County, Memphis, Indianapolis, and El Paso are less dense than Fort Worth).

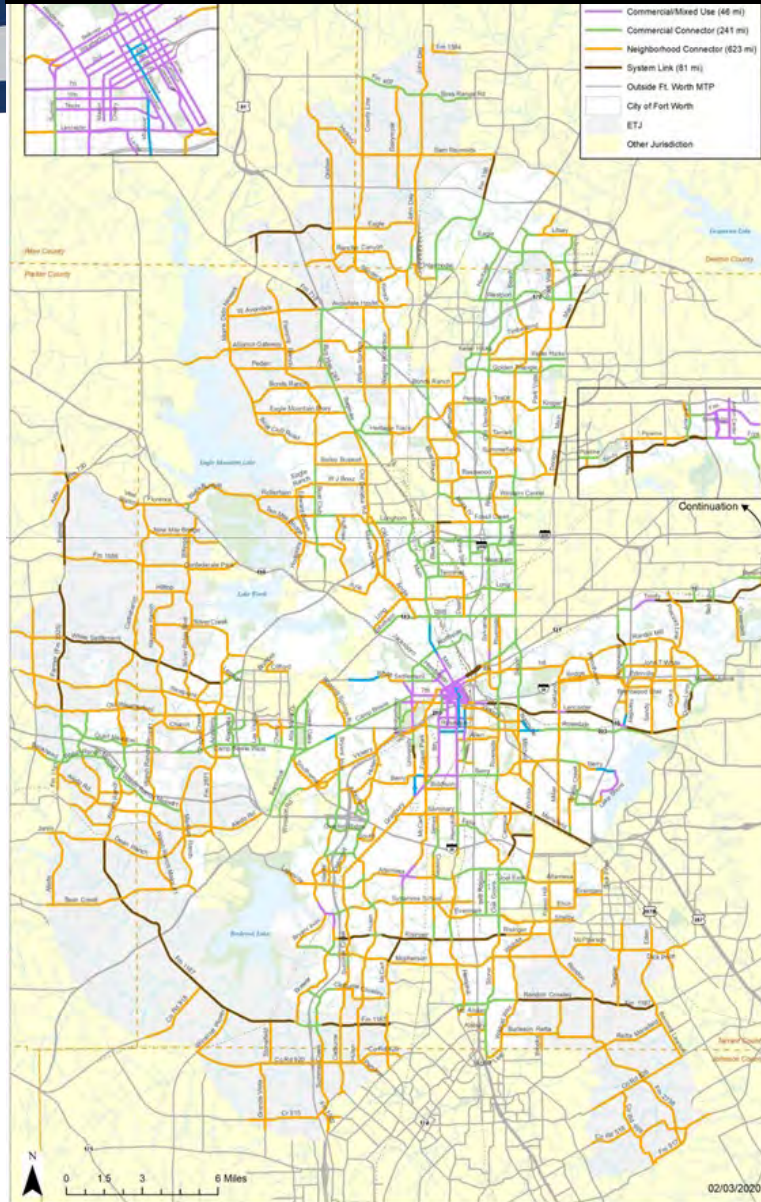


Census Says: Fort Worth Had America's Largest Population Increase in 2022

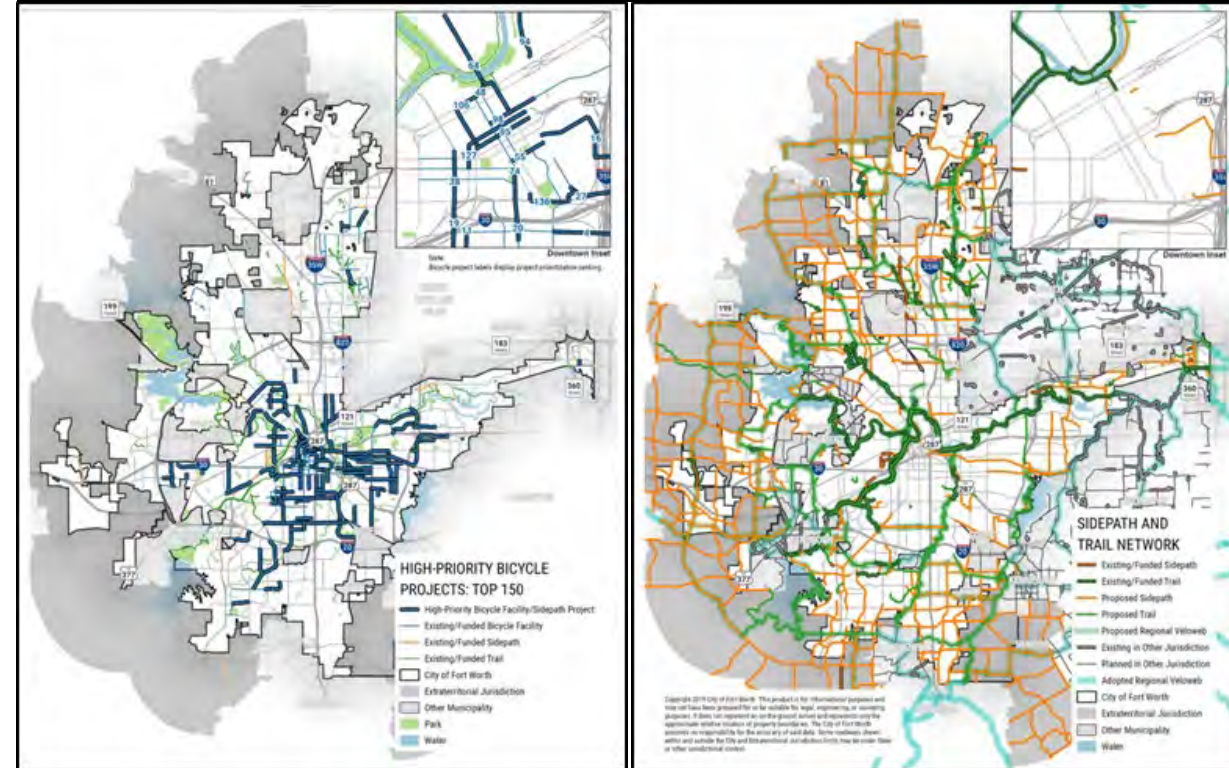

City of Fort Worth Master Thoroughfare Plan

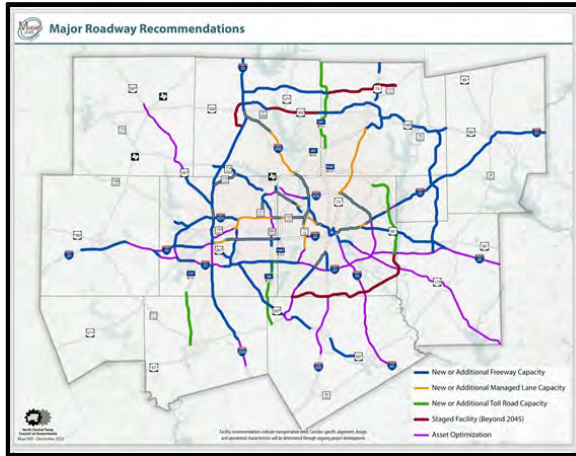


City of Fort Worth Major Transportation Plans

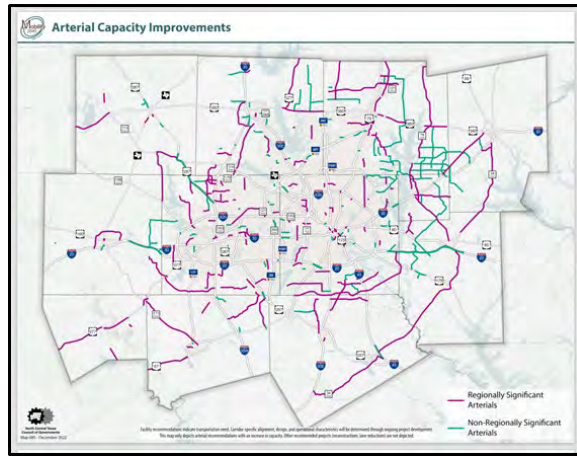
City of Fort Worth Active Transportation Plan



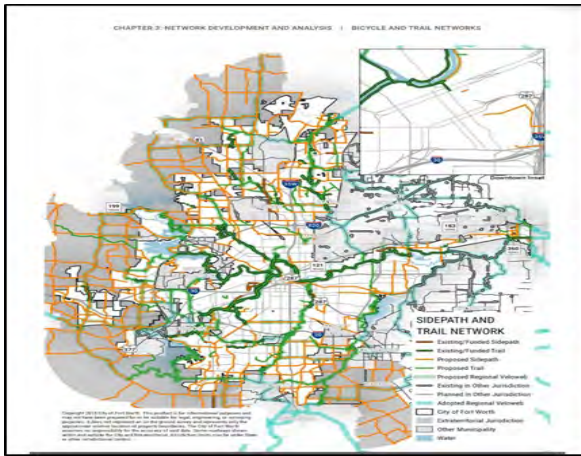

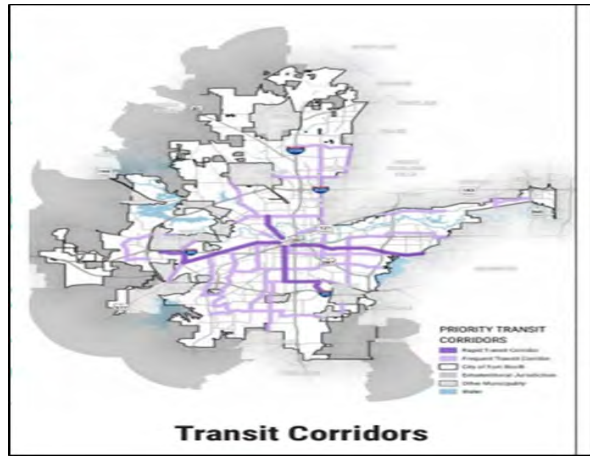

D. Scope Overview

- Duration: 24 months total for kick off through adoption (18-month core planning process)
- Discovery, Existing Conditions and Needs Assessment of policy/processes, programs, and plans.
- Performance Measures to evaluate multimodal transportation network
- Develop Gap Analysis and Unconstrained Needs Network
- Financial Revenue Enhancements with Forecasts
- Prioritized Projects List Program (Fiscally Constrained) and Adoptable Policy Amendments

E. Process

1. Public and Stakeholder Outreach (focus groups, surveys, etc.)
2. Discovery, Existing/Baseline Conditions, and Needs Assessment
3. Network Development
4. Implementation and Financial Plan, List of Prioritized (fiscally constrained)
5. Projects and Adoptable Policy Amendments*
6. Final Report
 - Council Action for amendment adoption

Business Equity (MWBE) goal requirements

Ordinance #25165-10-2021

1. City's Business Equity Goal on this project is 15% the contract amount
2. Contact Business Equity Office prior to bid submittal to obtain a current list of certified Business Equity firms. DVIN_BEOffice@fortworthtexas.gov
3. The Business Equity Utilization Form, Prime Contractor Waiver Form, Joint Venture & Good Faith Effort Form must be submitted with date/time receipt to Purchasing Office no later than 2pm; on the third (3rd) Business Day after the bid opening. The successful bidders are encouraged to submit these forms as soon as possible after the bid opening to allow time for discrepancies to be resolved.
