Solicitation Questions and Answers:**

Question 1: Is the transportation user fee anticipated to also fund operations and maintenance or just capital investment.

Answer: Not really building out new things right now, but needs may change as we go through the planning process. Really maintaining the system is what we are thinking how the user fees will be used.

Question 2: Does an in-progress certification with the North Central Texas Regional Certification Agency count for consideration as a certified Business Equity firm?

Answer: The Business Equity firm does have to be certified at the time of the proposal and before a compliance memo is issued to Mayor and Council (M&C).

Question 4: Is there any preference to a Project Manager being local or different city or state?

Answer: There is no local Project Manager requirement. We are open to PM being out of state, if you can work into budget, and get everything you need into the scope, the person understands Fort Worth and can bring innovative ideas then the City of Fort Worth is agreeable.

Question 5: We see that the City of Fort Worth updated its Transportation Impact Fees in 2022. Have you all discussed updating that study as part of the scope of this effort, in addition to looking at transportation user fees?

Answer: We will include the impact fee with fiscal analysis, but do not intend to update the study with the planning process. However, that could change if efficiencies can be found.
